

At Anchor in Shantar Bay

1866

Wednesday July 11

Begins with a thick fog and moderate wind from N.E. middle and latter part wind and weather the same over two boats still absent

Thursday July 12

Begins with foggy weather and light air from N.E. after dinner got under way at 4.30 came to anchor again middle and latter part fog and rain with light wind from N.E.

Friday July 13

Begins with a thick fog and light wind from N.E. at 2 P.M. had our two boats alongside they had found one whale middle and latter part weather the same sent off starboard and larboard boats and got under way

Saturday July 14

Begins with a thick fog and light air from N.E. came to anchor at 4 got under way at 5 came to anchor at 7 under way at 10 to anchor at 4 A.M. under way again at 6 to anchor at 11 under way at midnight to anchor again a thick fog

Sunday July 15

Begins with a thick fog and light E. breeze and sold the Peepers 1 Bk, Pork and 1 Cask 17 lbs. bread middle part clear and calm latter part foggy and calm took the middle in to fish

Monday July 16

Begins with clear weather and a calm just the pintal on the sudden except one and shipped it at 5.30 P.M. got under way at 9 came to anchor at 1 A.M. got under way again latter part foggy with light wind from N.E.

In Shantar Bay

Tuesday July 17

Begins with a thick fog and light variable air the ship started across the bay slowly at 8 P.M. heard several whals lower waist and bow boat at 11 they returned the whals having been galleyed latter part fresh breeze from stern quarter and clearer

Wednesday July 18

Begins with hazy weather and moderate wind from N.E. at 10 the two boats returned they had seen nothing but killed a bear middle and latter part hazy with light wind from same quarter came to anchor off Pilot Richard, Bk in 12 fathoms water

Thursday July 19

Begins with squally weather and light variable air at 11 P.M. sent off starboard and waist boats in a cruise middle and latter part foggy with light variable air employed in stowing down oil in the fore hold finished stowing down the whale stowing down about 65 barrels

Friday July 20

Begins with a thick fog and light air from N.E. with every likelihood of its remaining so middle and latter part wind and weather the same at 7 A.M. the two coming down got under way at 7 came to anchor again

Saturday July 21

Begins with a thick fog and light E. breeze air at 9 P.M. the waist and bow boats returned to the ship without seeing anything visible and latter part a thick fog and light rain storm from the same quarter

Sunday July 22

Begins with a thick fog and calm middle part foggy with rain and a calm latter part foggy and rain ceases
