

Laying at Anchor in Honolulu

1866

Wednesday Nov 28 1866

Begin with warm weather during the afternoon received 60 barrels more of water from the water boat, middle part a day of N.E. trade with much lightning in different parts of the horizon, latter part the same duty going on

Thursday Nov 29

The same duty still going on fitting the ship for sea, received on board ship stores consisting of beans (coffee, rice beans &c) (Cranberry) and the old cook still off duty received the sundries from there and hung it

Friday Nov 30

Begin with the same sultry weather received from them another scow load of provisions consisting of bread and molasses, also 60 barrels of water from the water boat all of which were stowed down, middle part the weather the same, latter part Cranberry on duty, the old cook still off, all hands busy preparing for sea

Saturday Dec 1st

Begin with warm weather received on board 40 bags of Irish Potatoes also 25 barrels of beer, middle part weather the same latter part completed in fitting ship for sea examined our best and found 8 barrels of water for use sent it back again

Sunday Dec 2nd

Begin with cooler weather during the day those who were went ashore Otto the cabin boy absent also Pardina

Monday Dec 3

No day received another water boat containing 60 barrels, Otto and Pardina still absent the old cook still off duty

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Tuesday Dec 4

Begin with warm weather, the two absentees still missing, the ship nearly ready for sea

Wednesday Dec 5

Begin with pleasant weather Otto and Pardina still absent, to day, during the forenoon the ship returned Otto to the ship Mr. King and Officer also came, two boatsteeps two foremast hands and a cook unboard and went on shore

Thursday Dec 6

Pleasant weather the 24 hours lying off and on Diamond Head, carried away main top sail gear in making sail, the young being better sent up a new one

Friday Dec 7

Begin with fine weather standing off and on Diamond Head, sent up a new top sail yard and bent the sail, middle and latter part the same the ship standing off and on

Saturday Dec 8

Pleasant weather all the 24 hours standing off and on at 11 A. M. received from shore a spec for a main top sail yard

Sunday Dec 9th

Begin with pleasant weather at 1 P.M. the Capt. came on board squared the yards and stood to the Southward, middle and latter part wind and surge the same
