

At Anchor in Puam

1867

Wednesday April 3

Begins with good weather and moderate wind from off the land, middle part wind and weather the same, latter part the same, the two men not yet taken

Thursday April 4

Begins with good weather and light wind from off the land; middle part the same latter part squally, at 11 A.M. the pilot came off and the ship got under way the two men not yet taken

Friday April 5

Begins with squally wind and rain from off the land, standing out through the reef, middle part wind and weather the same, latter part clear weather and moderate wind from off the land, standing off and on the town of Puam

Saturday April 6

Squally weather till 24 hours, at 6 A.M. saw a cow and calf, lower station and wreck boat, but did not strike, at 11 A.M. the Captain came off in the Pilot boat

Sunday April 7

Begins with partially cloudy weather, standing off and on the land, waiting for our two deejahs who had been taken, at 2 P.M. they were brought on board and delivered up, when they were at once put in irons, but were released at sunset and sent to their duty, two Chinamen were also received intended in the place of the deejahs, when we braced foreward and stood out to sea middle and latter part good weather heading to the Northward

Monday April 8

Begins with clear weather and moderate wind from E. N.E. heading N. middle and latter part the same took in the carbon boat to repair her

Tuesday April 9

Begins with clear warm weather and light wind from the E. steering N. middle part wind and weather the same, latter part clear and hot with light from the same quarter as the same, fitting up the boat &c

Wednesday April 10th

Begins with light pleasant weather from E to S.E. all sail set steering N.W. employed repairing boats and painting them and various other jobs about ship

Lat obs 20.12 N.

Thursday April 11th

Begins with light weather from S with rain squalls middle and last part wind from different points at 10 A.M. saw doubtful vessel bearing S by E, dist 20 miles hands employed

Friday April 12th

Begins with light breeze from S.W. with pleasant weather middle and last part calm steering N.W. with all sail set employed repairing and painting boats

Lat obs 21.25 N.
Long Chron 144.47 E

Saturday April 13th

Begins with light weather from S.W. steering N.W. middle and last part wind N.W. and fresh ship on different tacks all sail set

Lat obs 22.55 N.
Long 143.59 E
