The next day the old man went ashore we laid off and in while the boat was ashore about 5 o'clock in the afternoon the captain came aboard with 4 men and a boat load of fruit oranges bananas limes & hogs and some eggs and some chickens Squared in our yards and a tent for Cape Horn the rest of the voyage is kept as you will see daily.

Daily Log

Nov 25th Left St Nicholas on Wednesday Evening at 1857^h 5 o'clock Steering on the Wind. Heading S by W. Nothing remarkable pleasant weather light breeze

26th Light wind fast between Bone Vista and Fugo mending fore top sail, in the Evening we saw the burning Volcano on Fugo Island something we never saw before and it was a great sight to us we saw it all night and the sun rose and left it a stream of smoke



27th Pleasant weather steering S. S. W. took down our main sail and put up an old one, making Senate part of the day left of work at 4 o'clock and chose our boats crews opened the flap chest

28th Pleasant weather Steering before the wind heading S S W. we bent our lower studding sail and fore T. Salant sail and sent them out to day

Sunday 29th Pleasant weather Steering S W by W. to day I took my clothes and gave them an airing saw a ship this morning on our lee bow but could not make her out this afternoon we carried away our lower studding sail boom

30th Pleasant weather part of the morn't Steered S by E and rode down for stay saw a Bark on our weather bow saw a school of Black fish swimming in the afternoon Steering on the wind heading S S W.
