

March 24th 1858
 Pleasant weather strong breeze and running before it making at the rate of nine knots per hour heading S. W. by W. the Humphreys is worse to day he had another fit this morn the worst one he has had. set up the rigging fore and aft masts and for top and fork. the old man out the cook had a gravel but night on account of the cook's making his tea with salt water by mistake all hands complaining better to send home from Honolulu made men spin lines to the fore to prevent back stays. Lat 6° 03' S

25th Fine weather strong breeze strong before the wind heading S. W. by W. rained last night about 5 hours. the Humphreys is some better to day. the third mate wrote the cook had a fever this morning mending the main sail broke out for water and palm trees that did not come get them from the old man raised a school of sperm whales last night about sundown but could not get near them as they were a going to the windward very fast Lat 8° 35' S. Lon 93° 00' W

26th Light breeze pleasant weather running before the wind heading S. W. by W. broke out for top and fork. fin backs are a flying around the ship making rope to go up fore out at old cutting falls. the boys are sparring ship jacks the weather is very warm Lat 9° 30'

27th Pleasant weather but very warm no wind heading S. E. W. all hands employed on various small jobs the old man lowered his boat and tried his moccasins Lat 9° 2' S

March 28th 1858
 Sunday The weather is very warm no wind heading S. E. W. saw fin backs on all sides all hands went in swimming this morning the most of the foremast hands are having their hair cut off short Lat 9. 29. S. Long. 92. 0. W.

29th Fine weather light breeze strong at 11 A.M. saw a plenty of fin backs took all the chests on deck and washed out the foremast the old man for bit us getting any more onions. gave a new wheel rope served the jib foremast Lat 1° 46' S

30th Light breeze part of the day fine weather strong at 11 A.M. broke out the ship's back for clothing and blue Dyeing set up the Martin sails and jib gear's sorted over the potatoes and put them in the round house saw fin backs and grampas first the brown water bucket all hands in swimming some got stung by sea hells very bad the cooper made a box and took for the old man ins. the kids have begun to take whals to day Lat 0° 35' S.

31st Light breeze pleasant weather strong at 11 A.M. broke out the shell for rigging broke out sail pen and found a main top sail missing broke out the main hall but could not find it the Captain suspected some one of the crew so let it in fast broke out water and butter Lat 0° 12' S. Lon 98° 0' W

April 1st 1858
 Light breeze pleasant weather strong at 11 A.M. by S. made a pair of hose for the pump. cooper setting up casks for backs a playing around the ship the old man shot a lance at him without effect Lat 1° 35' S.
