

July 12th day calm. lying off the mouth of Plover Bay saw
 1858
 2 m. E. ship, sacks, malasses, and seals there is 8 seals in sight
 Lat 64° 30' N. Long. 171° W.

13th Fine weather light breeze standing off and on the
 Plover Bay a canoe came off last night at 12
 O'clock. They came on board but did not trade any
 there was 14 of them in the canoe they was on their
 way to some land to the Eastward of us
 about 50 miles. gannet with the Buck Black
 Warrior of Honolulu four months out one whale
 gannet with the Chip Champion Capt. Gray
 twenty months out twelve hundred bbls. of oil
 Lat 64° 11' N. Long. 171° W.

14th Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. steering
 along the coast to the northward and eastward the
 whal rope parted and we saw a new one. the carpenter
 ground his spades and boarding knives. to day saw
 1858
 2 m. E. ripsacks, and some mussy large killers. also saw
 nine seals. Lat 65° 9' N. Long 170° 11' W.

15th Fine weather light breeze ran into St. Lawrence
 Bay this morning and dropped anchor near our
 Indian settlement for water sent a raft of 14
 casks ashore but could not get good water came on
 board weighed anchor stood along the shore 10 miles
 dropped anchor again sent the raft ashore filled them
 and got them on board at 10 O'clock P. M.
 stored them in the main hall. five sails in
 sight. one boiling. all hands trading with the
 natives the old man and mate went a gunny and
 got 15 ducks. got our grog to night

16th Hazy weather calm most of the day weighed anchor
 at 9 A. M. but could not get out so we dropped
 anchor again at 3 P. M. the mate went gaming
 this forenoon got 5 ducks. the old man went this
 afternoon and got 33 ducks. saw two ships at
 the mouth of the bay.

July 17th Hazy weather light breeze from the S. weighed
 1858
 2 m. E. anchor this morning at half past twelve made sail
 and and saw two Bow Head whales at the mouth of
 the Bay toward all four boats but without
 success the whales were a going to the northward
 came on board at 1 O'clock P. M. made sail steering on
 the wind heading S. N. E. spoke the ship Speed
 Well. Capt. Lills 11 months out. sun obscure

Sunday 18th Hazy weather strong breeze from the S. steering
 1858
 2 m. E. on the wind heading N. by N. run into St
 Lawrence Bay again this forenoon under double reefed
 top sails. and dropped anchor. there is 7 ships at
 anchor in the Bay the Draco of New London
 is trying out the whale she got yesterday. the Benjamin
 Tucker of New Bedford came in.

19th Hazy weather strong breeze from the west
 1858
 2 m. E. weighed anchor at 3 O'clock this morning made
 sail steering on the wind heading S. N. E. spoke
 the Rousseau of New Bedford. 10 months out
 broke out for water bread and beef. 70 ships in
 sight at night. sun obscure.

20th Pleasant weather moderate breeze from the west
 1858
 2 m. E. dropped anchor at 11 O'clock last night on the coast
 of North America near the Bering Straights for
 the purpose of wooding up took the old waist boat
 off the House and sent it ashore and got off
 42 Boat loads of wood and stowed it in the
 main and for hold saw two Bow Head whales
 this morning one came along side trading

21st Fine weather most of the day light breeze from
 1858
 2 m. E. the W. weighed anchor this morning at 4
 O'clock steering before the wind heading S. N. E.
 all hands dressing fish cooper made a spruce
 box for the old man. the mate repaired the
 canvas net.
