

August 2nd gammed with the ship Mito Capt. South of New Bedford 33 months out one thousand sperm. thousand weight and Bon heads. the old man has given up going any farther north on account of other ships not seeing any whales we are steering S by W. in company with the Mito Lat 69.42. N.

3rd Raining most of the day. light breeze from the Southward. cruising steering all directions and in sight all day. saw Bon Head whales this morning lowered away all four boats. but without success. lowered again in the afternoon no success. broke out for water bread and flour broke a paddle in the Bow Boat. sun obscure

4th Hazy weather most of the day light breeze from the N. E. steering on the wind beating up to the ice gammed with the ship Hudson Capt. Barstow of New Haven thirty months twenty three hundred bbls of oil she is going home in this season. saw another sail to right sun. obscure.

5th Fine weather most of the day strong breeze from the N. steering on the wind beating to the windward broke out for beef and pork. saw whales at 1. O'clock P.M. lowered 3 boats but without success. and in sight about 20 miles off saw the ship Mito up to the windward. of us saw whales again at 8. O'clock P.M. lowered 3 boats the Bow Boat got fast to a cow whale and killed her about 12. past 9. got her along side and began to cut her in Lat 69.32. N. Lon 164 34

6th Hazy weather strong breeze from the N. steering on the wind under double reefed top sails beating to the starboard. finished cutting in the whale at 12. past 5. A.M. one sail in sight repaired the Bow Boat where she got stove yesterday in cutting in the whale we lost about 500 lbs. of bone stowed the bone in the fore hold snow squalls about once in 20 minutes.



August 6th whales all around us but too rough to lower for them and in sight to the Eastward of us about 30 miles off. Lat 69.29. N.

7th Fine weather strong breeze from the N. standing off and on the land plenty of whales in shore lowered all 4 boats the waist boat got fast and the whale stove the boat all to pieces but the boat staves the rest escaped unhurt the Bow Boat picked them up and brought them on board the ship the Starboard Boat got fast to a large cow whale and killed her and got along side began to cut her in at 11 O'clock P.M. Lat the same as yesterday.

Sunday 8th Fine weather light breeze from the N. lying at anchor about 10. miles off shore in 6 fathoms of water finished cutting in the whale at 5. O'clock A.M. blubber room full and fore hold full. put the old waist boat on the cranes this morning lowered the larboard and Bow Boat at 12. past 12. O'clock the larboard boat got fast to a bull whale killed him and got him along side began to cut him at 4 O'clock P.M. cut him in by 11. O'clock P.M.

9th Fine weather light breeze from the N. W. lying at anchor. lowered the larboard boat this morning at 2. O'clock she got fast to a bull whale. killed him and got him along side by 3. O'clock. cut him in and left the blubber on deck. started the fire under the try works at 12. O'clock this morning lowered the larboard and waist boats at 10. O'clock A.M. the larboard boat got fast to and killed a cow whale. towed her along side by 3 O'clock P.M. here we are blubber loged and a whale along side whales are feeding along side the ship.

10th Fine weather light breeze from the N. W. still lying at anchor. trying out oil broke out the after hold. lowered. stowing down oil in the lower hold. the whale the mate got yesterday and refitted it along side lowered the larboard boat this afternoon
