

October 30th Fine weather light breeze from the N.W. steering S. by E. washing bone. broke out studding sail. broke out top mast & studding sail. also broke out bag. pack. and cabbage. took the cabin steward out of the cabin & sent it and stowed away.
Lat 32° 58' N. Long 157° 8' W.

31st Pleasant weather strong breeze from the S. by W. steering on the wind heading S. by E. under double reefed top sails and reefed courses the main top gallant halibut packed last night. received halibut. nothing going on worth noting.
Lat 37° 37' N.

November 1st Pleasant weather but squally variable wind from all quarters steering S. by E. washing ship in the afternoon. Saw nothing.
Lat 29° 58' N. Long 155° 18' W.

2nd Fine weather light breeze from N.W. to E. curing and stowing bone in the forenoon in the afternoon repaired the new top mast studding sail. and sent up the boms and rigging. Cooper made a key to the Captain's chamber. Saw. broke out a new set of carpenter's tools. scraped the fore top mast & top gallant mast and royal mast. Lat 28° 6' N.

3rd Rainy weather blowing a moderate gale of wind from the S. Longing to under double reefed main top sail and fore sail. fore top mast stay sail. washing bone all day. saw a school of porpoises. Lat 27° 56' N.

4th Rainy and squally light breeze from the W. and N.W. steering S. washing bone. slushed the fore top mast and top gallant masts. broke and for malasses, onions, butter and sugar.
Lat 26° 30' N. Long 154° 20' W.

November 5th Fine weather light breeze and calm steering S. finished washing bone at 10. O'clock A.M. and curing all day. broke out the sail pen and took the sails and rigging on deck and dried them. took all the tow lines out of the tubs and dried them saw fin back whales. we stand no mast heads yet since we left the Arctic. Lat 25° 27' N. Long 154° 30' W.

6th Pleasant weather light breeze from the S. by W. steering on the wind heading S. by E. broke out the after hatch for butter and molasses sugar. sent the main sail down and repaired it. made a gangway to lay. the boats tars began to stand mast heads to lay. curing bone. broke out cabbage. Lat 24° 27' N.

7th Fine weather light breeze from the S. by W. steering on the wind heading S. by E. on one tick and W. on the other. took all the chests out of the fore-castle and gave it a good washing and cleaning out. saw 3 ships. one to the windward and 2 to the leeward of us. Lat 23° 27' N. Long 153° 4' W.

8th Fine weather light breeze from the S. by E. steering S. W. by E. broke out the last cask of water we had got. finished drying bone to day. saw 3 sails in sight ran down to the one to the leeward of us and jammed with her she was the Brighton of Dartmouth 3 hundred bbls. of oil this season from the Arctic at night sailing in company with the Brighton steering S. W. by E. Lat 22° 47' N. Long 154° 14' W.

9th Fine weather light breeze from the S. by E. steering S. W. by E. now till we raised the Island of the sea. raised it at 7. this morning all hands on deck washing ship and working in rigging. the Brighton is to the windward of us. 3 sails in sight.
