

November 10<sup>th</sup> Fine weather calm all day lying between the Salome and Cape of Diamond head. Broke out the Slop Cask for clothing and hands got clothing. got up both cables and bent them on to the anchors. scraped and slushed the mizen top mast and top gallant masts scraped the spoke poles. Lat. 22. 40. N.

11<sup>th</sup> Fine weather light breeze from the W. the steam tug and pilot took us in this morning in the Harbor. we dropped anchor at 9 O'clock A.M. The Captain went ashore and sent 2 barrels sweet potatoes and a quarter of beef aboard. in the afternoon we moved the ship along side the Mountain Wave of Boston. which will take our oil and burn to New Bedford. all hands ashore to night. we got our letters from home to day.

12<sup>th</sup> Pleasant weather got 2 casks of water this morning. hoisted the oil out of the Blubber room and the Wave took it. all hands ashore to night. The Captain took the 4 portages and the steward ashore and shipped them for the rest of the Voyage.

13<sup>th</sup> Fine weather breaking oil out of the fore hold and delivering it to the Wave. to night the old man let us have 2. 8. a piece. forward. all hands ashore to night.

14<sup>th</sup> Fine weather all hands came on board last night excepting Jeremiah all hands ashore to day. The ship Montauk came in to day.

15<sup>th</sup> Fine weather breaking oil out of the main hold Jerry came on board this morning after being in the calaboose after Sunday. The ship Mary came in to day.

November 16<sup>th</sup> Fine weather breaking oil out of the main hold and sending it on the Mountain Wave. an English Blipper came in to day and brought the U. S. Mail.

17<sup>th</sup> Fine weather breaking oil out of the main and fore hold. the old man is ashore sight the bark Newbery port of Stonington is lying off and on here.

18<sup>th</sup> Fine weather finished discharging oil at 3 O'clock P. M. 4 ships came in to day. the Newbery port of Stonington is lying off and on here. the Blipper Bark Yankee sailed to day for California she will carry the U. S. Mail. all hands ashore to night.

19<sup>th</sup> Fine weather began to bunch the bone to day and send it on the Mountain Wave. the Eliza Adams came in to day. all hands ashore to night.

20<sup>th</sup> Fine weather bunching bone in the forenoon could not bunch bone in the afternoon on account of the rain squalls. bought some brooms of the natives. the old man let us have 2. 8. a piece to night.

Sunday Fine weather all hands ashore to day. the ship Originabo of New Bedford came in to day. the French Man of War sailed this morning. all hands ashore to night.

22<sup>nd</sup> Fine weather finished bunching bone this afternoon at 3 O'clock. and put it on board of the Mountain Wave. of Boston. the captain took the Medicine chest ashore to recruit it. we have sent 800 barrels of oil. and sent 2. 3. 7. 6. lbs.
