

January 19<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering on the wind heading S and S. by W finished painting to day. nothing much going on to day. David and Parker are sick. Below saw nothing Lat 73° 5' S. Long 135° 28' W.

20<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering our course S by W. in the fore part of the day and S. W. in the latter part making sperm yarn. set up the fore top gallant rigging. cooper making bungs. carpenter made some sheathing for the rail. Lat 77° 8' S. Long 136° 11' W.

21<sup>st</sup>  
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering W. by S. cooper making bungs set up the main rigging. repaired the jib. piners made some bunks for water casks. David and Parker are sick yet. not on duty. Lat 75° 0' S. Long 137° 28' W.

22<sup>nd</sup>  
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering W. by S. we passed Picoa island this morning & Ocho. then we steered for the Island of Dominica. reached the island at 2 P.M. the Captain went ashore with the Main Boat crew and came off at 5 P.M. brought off some coconuts mums apples sweet potatoes &c. Laying off and on here. Lat 70° 0' S. Long 138° 11' W.

23<sup>rd</sup>  
 Pleasant but squally weather light breeze from the S. E. Laying off and on at Dominica for fruit gammed with the ship Oregon of Fairbairn 14 men this eve. the Captain went ashore this morning and came off at 4 O'clock P.M. brought with him some bananas bread fruit coconuts mums apples 7 pig 4 chickens &c. latter part of the day steering our course for Ootahoo.

24<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. raised the Island of Ootahoo this morning at 4 O'clock came into Ootahoo Bay and anchored at 7 O'clock.

January 25<sup>th</sup>  
 The ship Telline Licks of New Bedford is in here getting wood water and getting Liberty the Captain met and a boats crew went below to a bay to the leeward of to see if he could get trade there

25<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather Laying at anchor in Kapiti Bay weighed anchor this morning and came down here to get wood and water. James Ineson (a man we shipped in Honolulu) ran away last night got a hog to day and killed it sent a raft of casks ashore for water

26<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather Laying at anchor in Kapiti Bay got a raft of water and 2 boat loads of and stowed it down the Captain went up to Ootahoo Bay and found the runaway James Ineson on the ship Telline Licks brought him on board put him in irons in the run bought another pig.

27<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather Laying at anchor in Kapiti Bay got 3 boat loads of wood and a raft of water the Captain went up to Ootahoo Bay trading got some limes lemons plantains &c broke out for molasses.

28<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather got 5 loads of wood painted the yards stowed wood and water. the old man and the Captain of the Telline Licks went a hunting in a bay to the leeward of us about 12 miles they got some fruit and two goats one they killed and the other is alive.

29<sup>th</sup>  
 Fine weather got 2 boat loads of wood and stowed it in the main hatch. the Yena ha are fighting to day they have been at it this about 3 years. over a small bay to the leeward of us during the 3 years the skaters of Kapiti Bay has killed 2 men and wounded 3. of the natives of Ootahoo this they call great fighting
