

February 23rd Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering S. E. making spinnaker. working on the bowsprit shrouds. seizing new rattlines on the fore top mast rigging. saw a large bone shark about 40 feet long. Lat 7° 59' N. Long 178° 59' W.

25th Fine weather light breeze from the S. steering S. by E. coopers making bungs. knotting yarns and making spinnaker for bone. Lat 8° 17' N. Long 174° 37' W.

26th Fine weather part of the day strong breeze from the S. steering S. by E. making stowage for bone put chaffing mats on the fore top mast backstays. Lat 8° 17' N. Long 174° 30' W.

Monday 27th Pleasant but squally weather steering S. E. W. under double reefed top sails latter part of the day raining. Lat 7° 40' N.

28th Squally weather moderate breeze from the S. E. steering S. E. W. broke out for water. picking up spinnaker. Lat 10° 0' N.

March 1st Squally weather strong breeze from the S. E. steering W. by S. broke out water coopers made a duff. kield. for the cook. making rope for bone out of the old cutting falls. new flying jib sheets to day. Lat 12° 18' N. Long 173° 17' W.

2nd Squally weather strong breeze from the S. E. steering S. W. under single reefed top sails. making rope for bunching bone. Lat 15° 0' 16' N. Long 174° 22' W.

3rd Squally and rainy weather blowing a moderate gale from the S. E. steering S. W. under single reefed top sails all hands got soap to day from the Old Man. saw a school of porpoises this morning but too rough to get any grease. also is sick yet and off of duty. Lat 17° 3' N.

March 4th Pleasant weather light breeze from the S. E. steering S. W. making rope for bunching bone. saw new for top gallant sheets. saw land this morning on our lee bow it proved to be the Island of Oahu. Hunter fell on deck to day from the try works hurt him considerably. Lat 19° 16' N. Long 173° 58' W.

5th Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering different courses in order to get to the town of Pohnpei. steamed with the Ship Whitman Capt. Little of New Bedford 16 months out 250 blb of oil. came to an anchor in the bay of Pohnpei at 5 o'clock. P.M. got 80 blb of potatoes & bushel of beans. and a quarter of fresh beef. the Ship Architect is in here. after potatoes, &c. weighed anchor at 10 o'clock P.M. made sail and steered out of the bay we saw a burning volcano on Oahu. at night the Architect came out to night. broke out the after Hatch for beef and butter. Lat 19° 5' N.

6th Fine weather light breeze steering to the westward for Honolulu. we passed to the southward of the islands of Manu, Kaula, Nukunono, and Tenua. to day the Ship Whitman's ahead of us. Lat 20° 25' N.

7th Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. raised the rigging of Oahu this morning at 5 o'clock. ran down to the harbor the Captain went ashore in the barbed boat. the boat brought off a few letters from home. there is several ships lying off and on. Lat 21° 19' N. Long 173° 48' W.

8th Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. lying off coast of Honolulu. the Mate gave us permit to permit our oil casks. a large clipper ship anchored off the harbor in the Roads this morning. there is several vessels lying off and on here. the Ship Architect is one of them. a man was washed up last night. by being sent up to mast head for getting asleep on the lookouts. the barbed boat went ashore to day after the Captain he came on board. we are going to send our Spinnaker sail in the Ship Whitman. for New Bedford tomorrow. a lighter is coming out to take our oil in port.
