 Pleasant weather light breeze from the N. E. steering on the wind heading S. S. E. broke out for water the weather is very cold here. Lat 58. 5. N. Long 169. 5. E.

23rd
 Pleasant weather strong breeze from the N. E. steering on the wind heading S. S. E. broke out pork, beef, butter, molasses, coffee, beans, and flour. saw nothing. we stand no mastheads on account of the weather being so cold. Lat 57. 30. N. Long 170. 0. E.

24th
 78.59
 Sunday. Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering on the wind heading S. by E. broke out for water saw nothing. sun. obscure. no reckoning.

25th
 Fine weather in the forenoon but in the afternoon there came up a snow storm with the wind from the W. steering N. N. E. under double reefed topsails made two deck beams. The weather is very cold and every thing is covered with snow and ice. saw a fin back whale. Lat 58. 30. N.

26th
 Fine weather light breeze from the S. S. W. steering N. by E. broke out to bucco the foremast hands got to the spicer. saw a fin back whale. Lat 58. 12. N. Long 175. 15. E.

27th
 Fine weather but very cold strong breeze from the N. E. steering on the wind heading N. N. W. on one tack and S. S. E. on the other. got to the ice this morn. had to take the top of the rackets case off and take a spade to cut away the ice so we could use the helm.

28th
 Pleasant weather strong breeze from the N. N. W. steering various different courses to the eastward to keep clear of the ice. broke out for beef and water. saw a hump back whale in the ice. Lat 60. 3. N. Long 177. 43. E.

April 29th

 Fine weather blowing a moderate gale from the N. N. W. running along the ice to southward and eastward. saw a hump back whale in the ice standing quarters watches. Lat 58. 20. N.

30th
 Bazy weather light breeze from the E. steering on the wind heading S. S. E. running along the ice. saw a few fur seals. standing quarters watches. made a scotchman for the fore top mast stay. sun. obscure.

May 1st
 78.59
 Monday. Bazy weather blowing a gale of wind from the N. E. laying to under close reefed main top sail. fore top mast stay sail and main spencer. saw no ice sun obscure.

2nd
 Bazy weather and snowing. blowing a gale of wind from the N. W. laying to under close reefed main top sail fore top mast stay sail and main spencer. heading N. N. E. saw some fur seals. sun obscure.

3rd
 Faggy weather blowing a moderate gale of wind from the N. W. laying to under close reefed topsails broke out beef and pork. Lat. 58. 40. N.

4th
 Faggy and snowing strong breeze from the W. S. W. steering on the wind heading S. saw ice this morning we cannot go any further to the northward on account of the ice. Lat. 58. 36. N. Long 188. 50. E.

5th
 Snowing part of the day moderate breeze from the S. S. W. steering W. N. W. broke out water. the cooper had a fit this fore noon. Lat. 57. 44. N. Long 178. 18. W.

6th
 Pleasant weather light breeze from the S. E. steering N. by W. broke out a new main top gallant sail (Ransom Duck). broke out the Ship's Cask and coopered it. saw fin backs and hump back whales also saw ice. Lat 58. 20. N. Long 179. 20. W.
