

May 21st out oil, and the other is whaling with the boats down
 7.8.5.9. suppose one of them to be the Omega of Edgar Town
 at 6 o'clock P.M. saw Bow Heads in the ice but
 cannot get to them the ice being so heavy, saw some
 walrus, and seals. latter part of the day thick fog.
 Lat 60.10. N

22nd Fine weather strong breeze from the W. S. W. run down into
 Sunday a large bay of ice this morning saw no whales. this afternoon
 beat out of the bay and up to the ships Omega and ship
 Mary & both of Edgar Town. the Omega got a whale
 yesterday morning she will make about 120 bbls of oil
 the Captain of the Mary and Omega both came on board
 of us to night saw killers Lat 60.28. N

23rd Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. steering on
 the wind beating to the windward saw Bow Heads
 this noon saw 3 boats but without success came
 on board saw another Bow Head again at 6 o'clock
 P.M. lowered all 4 boats the West boat got
 fast to a whale she ran for the ice, and took about
 5.00. fathoms of line and lost her galled with Omega
 the Mary is in sight. Lat 60.29. N

24th Fine weather light breeze from the E. S. E. beating
 up in the bay repaired the scuttle butt. raised a sail
 this morning it proved to be the ship. Karsen
 Capt. Murdoch of New Bedford we galled with
 her and the Mary. the Omega is about 16 miles
 to the Southward of us. saw grampusses, and killers
 saw whales in the ice to night could not tell what they
 were. saw new fore sheets. Lat 60.25. N

25th Fine weather moderate breeze from the S. S. W.
 steering on the wind beating the windward in company
 with the ship Mary of Edgar Town. saw the Omega
 and Karsen this morning to the leeward of us 15 miles
 saw plenty of finback whales. along the ice broke out
 for water. galled with the Mary again to night and
 got some fine boxes and shells. Long 175.25. W.

May 26th Buggy weather strong breeze from the S. S. W. steering
 7.8.5.9. on the wind until 7 o'clock A.M. then run down
 along the ice. lost sight of the Mary this forenoon
 to the windward of us. saw finbacks. sun obscure.

27th Fine weather strong breeze from the S. W. running
 along the ice to the northward and eastward broke out
 water beef sugar rice coffee oil soap and flour. Venetian
 is sick and off duty. saw finbacks and grampusses.
 Lat 60.39. Long 174.34. W.

28th Buggy weather light breeze from the S. S. W. steering
 along the ice to the northward saw 3 sails this morning
 one to the windward and the other to the leeward of us.
 run down to the Lewis. Capt. Kiel of New Bedford
 23 months out 2 hundred bbls of oil. saw a Bow Head whale
 this morning in a little strip of ice lowered all 4
 boats but without success. Lat 60.38. N

29th Buggy weather light breeze from the S. S. W. steering
 Sunday through the ice to the northward and eastward saw the
 ship Karsen astern of us coming along in our wake. saw
 plenty finbacks. Lat 61.5. N. Long 173.20. W.

30th Buggy weather light breeze from the E. S. E.
 steering along the ice to the southward passed a whales
 carcass. raised a sail this forenoon at 7 o'clock run
 down to her and galled her it was the Bark Mary. &
 Susan of New Bedford. Capt. Plummer. she has taken
 8 whales that will make them 800 bbls of oil this season
 Lat

31st Thick fog most of the day light breeze from the
 Sunday E. S. E. steering on the wind along the ice to the
 southward when it is clear weather broke out a
 cask of bread. carpenter made a jig tackle for the
 Bow Boat. saw the Mary & Susan ahead of us.
 latter part of the day blowing a moderate gale from
 the E. S. E. we are under the lee of the ice.
