Dues
Fine weather strong breeze from the N. E. & turning N. by
E. bore out for water and hee. sun is above reefed the
top sails at 1 o'clock P.M. Lat 60.30. N Long 177.8. W.

2nd
Dues
Thick fog all day blowing a moderate gale from the
S. E. laying the under close reefed topsails heading S.
P. W. saw ice at 6 P.M. more ship heading S. N. E
sun obscure no reckoning.

3rd
Dues
Buggy weather strong breeze from the N. E. running
along the ice to the southward and Eastward saw a
plenty. Bow Head birds. and feed but no whales. every
body in the ship has got a cold which is very
disagreeable. in this weather sun obscure no reckoning.

4th
Dues
Pleasant weather part of the day steering on the
wind heading S. W. Hunter got furnished to day
for waisting grubb. and had half a pot of tea and
one hard bread for supper. saw 2 sails one to the
ward and the other to the windward also saw a fine
back whale and ice on our lee beam. Lat 60.35. N
Long 177.16. W.

5th
Dues
Pleasant weather part of the day. light breeze from W. N. E.
cruising up and down the ice saw a Bow Head this morn
lowered all 4 boats in company with the ship Lewis and
Nassau boats but without success. spoke the Nassau she
has taken one whale since we gummed with the ship Lewis
has not one whale. the Marys boat got fast to a whale to
night in the edge of the ice. to night we went into the
ice about 4 miles saw nothing and came out again. sun obscure.

6th
Dues
Pleasant weather calm in the forenoon and very light breeze in the
afternoon. lowered 3 boats and went of in the ice in search of
Bow Heads. saw one in the afternoon at 5 o'clock got fast to
a cow whale. she took all this time he came up again and the
Bow Boat got fast to her turned her up toward her alongside
and began to cut her in the Nassau Lewis Mary are in sight
the Mary got a whale to day. the All men made a new mast
for the Starboard boat. Lat 61.35. N Long 178.20. E.



June 7th

Pleasant weather light breeze from the N. E. finished
cutting in the mates whale at 7 o'clock. A.M. the
Starboard and Thist boats lowered among the Starboard
Boat got fast to a Bull whale turned him up got
him alongside and cut him in sun about 150 Bow Heads.
the Starboard lowered among got fast to a whale he took
his line and ran away with it. the whales are all heading
to the S. E. sun the Mary, Nassau, and Lewis are all
boiling and whaling. Lat 61.20. N.

8th
Dues
Fine weather light breeze from the N. E. started the fire under
the try pots at this morning at 5 o'clock. lowered the boats
several times but without success the ship Lewis got a whale
this morning the Mary and Nassau are a whaling and trying
out saw plenty whales but they were going very fast to the
windward the Starboard boat lowered got fast to a whale
killed him got him alongside and began to cut him in

9th
Dues
Thick fog finished cutting in the mates whale this morning
we drifted away from the ice last night the Mary Nassau
and Lewis are all trying out. broke out water and molasses
sun obscure

10th
Dues
Pleasant weather strong breeze from the N. E. running along the ice
to the eastward. trying out and steaming slowly oil in the
fore hold saw Bow Heads. in the edge of the ice lowered all
4 boats the Bow Boat got fast to a whale. he took his line
away the Thist Boat got fast to a whale he took his line
away with him also the Starboard Boat got fast to a Bull
whale. he took his line about when he came up we got the line
again killed him got him alongside and cut him in the ship
Mary Nassau and Lewis are in sight Lat 61.35.

11th
Dues
Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. finished cutting the
mates whale this morning. trying out and steaming spoke the
ship Omega of Coljar Town Capt Kiel. she has taken
she has taken 6 whales since we saw her last. the ship
Mary Nassau and Lewis and a Bark. are in sight to the
Toward of us. broke out two lines for the boat. saw Bow Head
whales this morning. Lat 61.50. N.
