

June 12th Fine weather light breeze from the W. running along the ice to the eastward trying out and stowing down in the fore hold gummed with ship Omega and Lewis and Bark North Eliza Adams. The Eliza Adams, has took 8 whales. there is 9 sails in sight Dutch Charles cut his foot with a spike this morning. he has got a watch below.

73th Thick fog light breeze from the S by W. sun & ships and birds. This morning we run into the ice this forenoon. came on a thick fog. clewed up all sail and let drift there is plenty whale food here in the water. trying out oil. gummed with the Bark Tybee of Stonington Capt Freeman. 1 whale this season Edward Dean and Charles. is below.

74th Fine weather light breeze from the S. trying in the ice trying out and stowing down oil in the After Hatch saw plenty Porpo Heads. lowered the Larboard and Starboard Boats the West Boat got fast to a Bull whale killed him towed him along side and began to cut him in 3 sails in sight Lat 61. 20. N

75th Fine weather light breeze from the S. trying in the ice with all sail furled. finished cutting in the West Boats whale. trying out and stowing down in the After Hatch broke bag and spilt our whale blubber for them but without success. they were going S. by E.

76th Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. steering into S. E. trying out oil made sail got out of the ice at 10 o'clock P.M. 7 sails at the edge of the ice. 10 past 12 raised 8 or 10 tons whale made all sail started for it. with 5 ships chasing us sent the Larboard Boat to the whale she got there 5 minutes before another boat. cut the ribs out and let them go to the bottom. got him along side and cut him in gummed with the ship Hibernia of New Bedford Capt Edwards lost the whale head and bone.

77th Foggy weather strong breeze from the S. W. steering on the wind trying out oil saw a ship close to supposed her to

June 17th a Frenchman. Hunter fell from the spunker boom this noon which hurt him very much we carried him forward - senseless broke out for water and butter we have Duff for dinner every day now. sun obscure.

78th Foggy weather strong breeze from the S. W. trying out oil and stowing down in the After Hatch. saw the ship Omega close to. Hunter Charles and Edward are off duty sun obscure

79th Foggy weather strong breeze from the S. W. steering on the wind under short sail. trying out oil saw nothing. Hunter is about the same broke out water and vinegar for setting up casks. sun obscure.

80th Thick fog all day strong breeze from the S. W. trying out and stowing down in the main Hatch broke out water saw nothing Hunter. Edward and Charles are off duty

81th Foggy weather moderate breeze from the S. E. steering on the wind heading S. by E. trying out oil saw 1 ship close to saw plenty ice. dead reckoning Long 178 S. 4. E. Lat 61 20 N.

82nd Foggy weather strong breeze from the S. E. steering on the wind heading S. by E. finished trying out this morning at 5 o'clock finished stowing down oil in the main Hatch our 6 whales made us about 550 lbs of oil. saw ice the weather is very cold the rigging is all ice broke out the Eliza cash cash all got clothing sun obscure.

83rd Thick fog and very cold moderate breeze from the W. S. W. beating out of a bay off ice under short sail. broke out for tobacco. molasses. oil. hats. pins. pots. shovels and knives all hands got as much tobacco as they wanted. 3 ships and 1 Bark in sight.

84th Thick fog in the forenoon cleared up in the after noon with a light breeze from the west steering on the wind heading S. by W. gummed with the ship Erie of New Bedford Capt Jamieson 20 months out 15 hundred lbs of oil gummed with the Bark Tybee of Stonington. Capt Freeman. 6 whales this season. we burn
