

June 24th from the Tybe that the bark of New Bedford lost two boats and crews, about a week ago they made one 3rd mate got fast to a whale, the whale towed them in to the ice and came on a thick fog they have not been seen or heard from since supposed they are frozen to death, there were 12 men in all. Cape Horn in sight also 3 sails in sight one Bark trying out.

25th Pleasant weather light breeze from the S. W. steering all directions to the northward and eastward all things scraping bone jammed with the Ship Hammond. Island of New Bedford 18 months out no oil jammed with the Bark Fortune of New Bedford. no oil this season. Cape Thaddeus in sight in our weather quarters also 5 sails the Fortune and Henry Island are close to Lat 63. 10. N.

26th Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. steering to the northward and eastward. Land on our line weather quarters about 25 miles off. 5 sails are in sight, also saw rip sack whales Lat 63. 14. N.

27th Fine weather light breeze from the S. steering to the northward and eastward. spoke the Ship Speedwell Capt. Gibbs of New Bedford. no oil this season also spoke the Ship Carataga of New Bedford. Capt. the Fire Paulina and Tyke and 70 other ships are in sight Lat 64. 19. N. Long 139. 40. W.

28th Fine weather light breeze from the W. steering all directions land to the westward of us distant 10 miles jammed with the Bark Tyke of St. John's. Capt. Brown 3 months. This season spoke the Ship Kater-saff of New Bedford 6 whales this season. 76 sails in sight spoke the Bark Corington of Warren 6 whales. It is trying out. Lat 64. 46.

30th Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. cruising along the coast. washed ship inside to day. jamming with the Bark Paulina of New Bedford Capt. Allen. 22 months out 7. 100 lbs of oil no whales this season. spoke the Bark Corington of Warren. Land 8 miles off. 70 sails in sight heard a New Head last night. Lat. 65. 40.

July 1st Fine weather light breeze from the S. S. W. steering on the wind in the forenoon steering S. S. E. in the afternoon. spoke the Ship Draco of New London 3 years out 800 lbs. of oil. overhauled the cutting blocks. jammed with the Paulina. to night we are sailing in company with south other main land in sight 10 sails in sight.

1 Fine weather light breeze from the S. W. steering S. S. E. in company with the Paulina. trying bone and steering it got up the cable and bent on to the Starboard anchor jammed with the Ship S. S. S. of New Bedford. Capt. Louie 20 months out. 800 lbs this season. main land on our Starboard beam and St. Lawrence Island on the starboard beam. Hunter is sick yet and Charles is below Long 139. 10. W. Lat 63. 33. N.

7th Fine weather light breeze from the S. E. steering to the northward in company with the Paulina. broke out water and anvil. the Ship S. S. S. Omega. and a Bark to the northward of us is try out don't know who she is in between the main land and St. Lawrence Island an Esquimaux boat come of to us last night to trade but did not stop long. saw rip sack whales. repaired the Bone Boat. we are now in West Longings and we gain a day. Lat 63. 54. N.

2nd Fine weather strong breeze from the S. W. we cannot go any farther north on account of the ice so we are heading to the southward sailing in company with the Paulina 3 ships in sight. we are between St. Lawrence Island and main land. no settlement on the Island. broke out water Lat 64. 30.

3rd Foggy weather strong breeze in the forenoon steering on the wind heading S. S. E. at 3 o'clock P. M. found ourselves within a mile of St. Lawrence Island. dropped anchor in 14 fathoms of water. there is a strong current setting to the south here. a native boat come of to us at night the old man recast a jamming shot one Seal. sun obscure.
