

January 11th Fine weather strong breeze from the southward and westward. Steering S. by E. saw a new fly fish hatched. caught a porpoise. George is some expense to day. Lat 56.14. S. Long 77.00. W. saw two seals.

12th Squally weather strong breeze from the southward and westward. Steering S. by E. saw a new main top gallant standing sail. Boatstaves standing mast heads. George is about the same. saw plenty fin back whales. Lat 55.40. S. Long 72.20. W.

13th Pleasant weather part of the day strong breeze from the S. steering on the wind heading N. by E. but until we reached the Main Land near the Cape Horn. stood in till 12 miles of land. Tacked ship and took off land saw 2 seals broke out water. Lat 56.14. S. Long 69.15. W.

14th Pleasant weather moderate breeze from the S. E. steering on the wind heading to the windward. George is below sick. saw land this morning it proved to be the San Diego Islands. broke out top and fore. The Clipper Ship Great Republic of New York. passed close to us this noon bound westward. Lat 57.2. S. Long 68.4. W.

15th Fine weather strong breeze from the S. W. steering N. by E. part of the day. having made a passage of 89. days from the Sandwich Islands to the Horn we have the Pacific behind and enter the Atlantic once more on our passage. home. signalled an American whaler she was steering E. Long 66.7 W. Lat 56.36. S.

16th Pleasant weather moderate breeze from the N. W. steering N. by E. raised land this morning at daylight in our landward bow. the land proved to be Easter Land. the 7th Main and Long Mags. are below sick. saw 5 seals & of them bound to the Horn. signalled a Hamburg. brig bound to the Horn. the foremost Masts began to stave mast heads to day saw fin back whales. Lat 55.46. S. Long 68.14. W.

January 17th Fine weather moderate breeze from the southward and westward steering N. by E. the 7th Main and George is below sick. broke out water. saw fin back whales. Lat 53.30. S. Long 61.18. W.

18th Fine weather strong breeze from the N. S. W. steering N. by E. raised the Faulkland Islands. At 12 this noon on our starboard bow. 20 miles off. passed to the northward and westward of them. the 7th Main came on deck to day. George is below yet. saw fin back whales. Lat 52.00. S.

19th Fine weather light breeze from the N. steering on the wind heading S. by E. saw some of the Faulkland Islands this morning on our lee quarter. George is below yet. saw fin back. Lat 50.12. S. Long 61.62. W.

20th Breezy weather strong breeze from the N. E. steering on the wind heading N. by E. broke out top and fore. George is below yet. saw fin back whales. Lat 47.42. S. Long 60.26. W.

21st Breezy weather strong breeze from the N. steering on the wind heading S. by E. parted the fore top gallant sheet and head-carrying of the main sail in a squall. George and myself are of duty. Lat 48.30. S.

22nd Fine weather light breeze from the S. S. W. steering N. George and myself are below. saw hump back whales. Lat 47.47. S. Long 58.30. W.

23rd Pleasant weather. fore part of the day wind S. W. steering N. at 1 o'clock P. M. wind hauled round to the Northward and Westward. steering on the wind heading N. E. by E. Broke out water. repaired an old Main top sail. Saw porpoises. George is below yet. I am below and expect to be for some time. Lat 46.42. S.

24th Fair weather. Strong breeze from N. N. W. steering on the wind heading N. E. by N. George and myself is below yet. saw nothing. double reefed top sail at sun down. Lat 46.42. S.
