

March 16th 1860
 Weather fair and pleasant strong breeze from the E. steering N.W. by W. employed to day in working in the mizen rigging cut off about two foot off of the new fore top sail it being too large, saw nothing George & Muggs is worse to day John Hoxie is about the same. Lat 12. 38. N. Long 50. 36. W.

17th Pleasant weather moderate breeze from the E. steering N.W. by W. employed to day strapping blocks for the main rigging took the shattering off of the sail and washed it ready for painting sent down the chain cutting pennants, broke out water, killed another pig to day, and we have two more left, saw nothing over the netting George Muggs and John Hoxie are about the same Lat. 14. 1. N. Long

18th 1860
 Weather fair and pleasant moderate trade winds from the E. steering N.W. George & Muggs is about the same Hoxie by seems to be getting better. I suppose we shall be at home shortly now. The Captain gives her twenty days to go to New Bedford from here in Lat 15. 34. N. Long 51. 04

19th Fair weather light breeze from the E. steering N.W. by N. painted the inside of the ship to day. It is not calm enough to paint out side. George and John are getting along very well saw nothing but Gulf. Lat 16. 36. N. Long 56. 30. W.

20th Pleasant weather light breeze from the E. E. with half past eleven, A.M. when we got the wind from the northward with rain squalls. The trade winds left us last night, painted the fore yard and jib boom this fore noon cut up mould spare jib boom to day for fire wood broke out aboard of her and put the sun cross the Equator last night which makes it rainy and bad weather, saw nothing sun obscure.

March 21st 1860
 Fairly weather light breeze from eastward and southward the old man took his chest on deck to day took every thing out of it and placed in the fore most painted the main mast and main yard, sent a sail, in our weather here. George is worse, John is about the same. Lat 18. 34. N. Long 58. 56. W.

22nd Fair weather in the fore noon wind from the N.E. steering N.W. by W. finished painting the spars and yards to day. repaired the main top gallant standing sail saw nothing the carpenter made a pair of crutches for John Hoxie to walk with he's leg is got along very well George & Muggs is about the same. Lat 21. 01. N.

23rd Pleasant weather strong breeze from the N.E. steering N.W. painted the foremast and the aft top cabin, painted the ship's name on the fresh water buckets saw a whale breaching could not tell what it was Lat 21. 43. N. Long 60. 43. W.

24th 1860
 Weather fair and pleasant light wind from the N.E. steering N.W. by N. painted the house and bulwarks out side also finished painting the yards broke out water, scraped the mizen top mast and slashed it. Lat 22. 53. Long 61. 45. W.

25th Fair weather calm most of the day steering N.W. by N. when we had a breeze, the Captain made out our bills to day every one knows what his bill is now, each one of the crew got their Protection from the Captain. George Muggs is about the same John Hoxie by is getting along quite smart, saw nothing. Lat 23. 27. N.

26th Fair weather very light breeze from the N. steering N.W. by N. unbutton the main sail and repaired it sent it again bent a new cotton Duck fore sail a new cotton Duck fly jib, caught a Dolphin to day finished painting the out side of the ship this fore noon George and John are about the same Lat 24. 17. N. Long 62. 04. W.
