Wednesday June 28th first and middle part light winds from E. & S. steering W. & S. W. latter part calm all sail set Pizarro Pico St George in sight no obs

Thursday June 29th first part light winds from E. to S. E. middle part strong winds at 8 A.M. the Capt went ashore at St George at 4 P.M. home on board with a few recruits latter part about calm so ends this day No obs

Friday June 30th first part light winds from E. & S. to S. E. lying off and on at St George middle and latter part calm so ends this day between St George & Pico no obs

Saturday July 1st first part Calm middle part light winds from S. & W. lying between Pico & St George at noon a boat come alongside to smuggle sold them to boxes of tobacco later part steering E. & S. E. ^{in sight} Pico Lat 38 25 N Long 22 30 W

Sunday July 2nd first part light winds from N. W. steering S. E. by E sent the 1st ballant Studingsail boom & fore T. mast Studingsail boom aloft and set the Studingsails latter part steering S. E. all sail set St Michel 40 miles distant so ends this day

Monday July 3rd first part light winds from N. W. steering S. E. took in the light sails at 3 A.M. halled aback at 5 A.M. made sail and stood for the town at 8 A.M. the Capt went ashore at 6 P.M. came on board with recruits latter part lying off and on at St Michel at 11 P.M. a boat came on board to smuggle to tobacco sold them 6 boxes and some powder

Tuesday July 4th first part fine weather wind from N. to N. E. ship lying off and on at St Michel 8 A.M. went ashore at 12 P.M. came on board with recruits at 6 P.M. went ashore at 6 P.M. returned so ends the 4th of July

Wednesday July 5th first part lying off and on at 2 A.M. squared away and steering S. by E. latter set the Studingsails to Margo in sight steering S. E. by S wind N. N. W. Lat 37 00 North

Thursday July 6th first and middle part light winds from N. N. E. latter part strong winds steering S. all sail set Lat 35 48 N Long 24 37

Friday July 7th first part strong winds from N. E. steering South middle part took in the Studingsails latter part wind from East set the Studingsails again so ends these 24 hours all sail set Lat 33 24 North Long 22 30 West

Saturday July 8th first and middle part strong winds from E. steering S. by W under all sail latter part the same Lat 30 40 N Long 22 05 W

Sunday July 9th first part strong winds from E steering S. by W under all sail middle and latter part winds from E. N. E. steering S. by W one sail in sight Lat 27 48 North Long 21 40 West

Monday July 10th first part strong winds from E. N. E. steering S. by W. middle and latter part wind N. E. under all sail so ends squally employed in breaking out water one sail in sight also rice Beans & Flower Lat 25 18 N Long 22 05 W

Tuesday July 11th all these 24 hours strong winds from E. to E. N. E. steering S. by W under all sail employed in coping m. rig Lat " N Long " West

Wednesday July 12th this day begins with strong winds from E. & S. E. steering S. by W under all sail at 8 P.M. hored for pitchfork. At 8 P.M. came on board Lat 22 40 N Long 22 38 W
