

Bound to the Indian Ocean 1854

Saturday August 5th this day begins with a light wind from S steering N.S.W. under all sail latter part the same employed in breaking out water so ends Lat 00 44 S Long 1 30 West

Sunday August 6th all these 24 hours light winds from S to S.S.E steering to the Southward and westward under all sail Lat 2 33 S Long 23 03 W

Monday first part moderate winds from S.E to S steering Aug 7th to the Southward and westward by the wind middle part took in the No. 1 Gallant sail & Mizzen & mast stay sail latter part strong winds Lat 4 42 S Long 25 17 W

Tuesday August 8th all these 24 strong winds from S.S.E to S by E under all sail employed in ship duty so ends these 24 hours Lat 6 46 S Long 41 25

Wednesday August 9th first and middle part strong winds from S.S.E took in the No. 1 Gallant sail Middle part took in the fly Jib & gaff top sail latter part single reefed the topsails & set top gallant sails over them & set the fly Jib & gaff topsails wind S.E steering S.S.W by the wind Lat 8 57 S Long 51 55

Thursday Aug 10 first part strong winds from S.E to S.S.E took in the fore top gallant sail and fly Jib Middle and latter part took in fly Jib and set it again steering from S.S.W to S.W on sail in sight Lat 10 55 South Long 2 36 West

Friday Aug 11th first and middle part squally took in the fly Jib and gaff top sail wind from S.E to E.S.E steering to Southward by the wind latter sent down the No. 1 Gallant yard so ends Lat 13 38 S Long 30 38

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Saturday Aug 12th first part moderate winds from S.E employed in fishing the No. 1 gallant yard and bending the No. 1 Gallant sail sent it up again and sent down the No. 1 Royal yard Middle part strong winds latter sent down the Main Royal yard so ends this day Lat 15 26 S Long 31 03

Sunday August 13th first and middle part light winds S.E to E.S.E steering from S to S.S.E by the wind latter part wind E by S steering S.E by S by the wind under all sail Lat 17 22 S Long 31 02 West

Monday Aug 14th first part wind E.N.E steering S.E by S employed in sending down the No. 1 sail and sending another one up Middle part the same latter equally with light winds from all around the Compass all hands employed breaking out the No. hatch and for flour and bread and cooping it so ends this day Lat 18 48 S Long 30 45 West

Tuesday Aug 15 first part of this day commenced with light winds and rain squalls from all around the Compass all hands employed in breaking out the No. hatch and cooping bread and flour Middle part the same latter part wind from E by N to E.S.E employed in breaking out the No. 1 hatch and cooping bread and flour in sending down the table the man dropped it bel and struck the second mate on the head and knocked him senseless we held him and roused him with spirits and he soon revived but he is not able to set up so ends this day Lat 19 18 S Long 30 4 1/2

Wednesday Aug 16 first part light winds from E to E.N.E steering to the Southward by the wind middle part calm latter part light wind from E to E.S.E at 8 A.M. saw Trinidad bearing 90 miles Dis Lat 21 50 S Long 28 42 W Lat 19 50 S Long 29 42
