

Sunday Feb 11th 1835

All the 24 hours light winds & calms from all quarters under short sail through the night latter part the wind S.W. steering S.W. by S. ends raising Lat 6.36 S Long 38.58 E

Monday Feb 12th first part calm & squally under all sail Middle under short sail latter part under all sail Lat 7.08 S Long 38.39 E

Tuesday Feb 13th first part of this day light winds from W. N. W. steering S.W. by S. under all sail Middle squally latter part moderate winds from W. by S. steering S.W. by S. employed in setting the fore top Gallant futtee shrouls so ends this day Lat 8.08 S Long 38.23 E

Wednesday Feb 14th first part light winds from S.W. steering S.W. by S. the wind Middle under double reefed latter under all sail so ends easy No obs

Thursday Feb 15th first part very under all sail wind from S.W. steering S.W. by S. Middle part under double reefed wind steering to the E by the wind latter part under all sail Lat 8.35 S Long 39.40 E

Friday Feb 16th first part light winds from the W. steering to the S.W. by the wind sometimes the wind from all quarters sent down the ship without sail menning it. I sent it up again Middle under short sail the wind S.W. steering S.W. by S. latter under all sail wind W. steering S.W. by S. Lat 9.02 S Long 39.49 E

Saturday Feb 17th first part light winds from S.W. steering S.W. by S. under all sail Middle part under short sail latter part squally with fine rain No obs

Sunday Feb 18th first part moderate winds from S.W. steering to the E.S.E. employed in setting the Middle part steering E under short sail the wind S.W. latter part one sail in sight Lat 9.30 S Long 41.05 E

Monday Feb 19th all these 24 hours light winds and calms from all around the compass one sail in sight employed in washing our clothes the S.W. by S. Long 41.03 E

Tuesday Feb 20th all this day light winds and calms steering diff courses one sail in sight at 5 P.M. the bark lowered a boat the Capt Ray came on board the bark proved to be the bark Corditz of London Capt Ray 32 months out 900 Tons so ends this day No obs

Wednesday Feb 21st nearly all these 24 hours calm the Bark the Corditz in sight at 2 P.M. Capt I went on board at 8 P.M. returned latter part light winds Lat 9.18 S Long 41.01 E

Thursday Feb 22nd first part light winds from S.W. steering to the S.W. by the wind the Corditz in sight at 5 P.M. Capt I went on board & took 2 nil Mate came on board of us we exchanged some Flour for some Peas Middle took in the light sails at 10 P.M. the Capt returned wind E.S.E. steering S.W. by S. the wind latter under all sail Lat 9.08 S Long 40.44 E

Friday Feb 23rd all these 24 hours light winds from all quarters steering S.W. where we could under all sail this day at mid whole watches employed in scouring the iron & rust of the chumls so ends No obs
