

Saturday Feb 24th 1855
nearly all these 24 hours strong winds from
N.W. to W steering N.E. under all sail
employed in washing the ship outside

Lat 70° 39' Long 61° 33' E
Sunday Feb 25th first part of Middle
part strong & dry from N.W. to W Middle
steering N.E. under all sail

Lat 70° 29' Long 62° 43' E
Monday Feb 26th all these 24 hours good
weather and a light wind from W to N
steering E.N.E. employed in painting ship
out side somewhat 60388 Long 62° 13' E

Tuesday Feb 27 first part the wind N.W.E
steering & some squally with rain at 5 P.M.
boarded the boat for 1/2 Whales the 1st boat
struck at 10 took him to the ship and
commenced L.B. hauling
later part employed in cutting
so ends this day

Wednesday Feb 28th first part employed
in cutting at 11/2 P.M. finished Middle
& later light baffling winds at 5 P.M.
start of the work so ends boiling

Lat 60° 43' Long 65° 11' E
Thursday March 1st first part of this
day good breeze from W to S.W. to steering
to the N by the wind under double
reefs employed in boiling - Middle part
finished later part under all sail washed
off decks Lat 60° 43' Long 64° 40' E

Friday March 2nd this day begins with
squally weather steering E.S.E. under all sail
wind from W to N.W. later steering E
employed in coaling the port side
later employed in laying down

Lat 60° 38' J
Long 65° 21' E

March
Saturday 3rd first and Middle
part winds from S.W. to N steering
from E.S.E. to E.N.E. employed in
steering down the oil so ends this day

No do
Sunday March 4th first part of
this day employed in steering down oil
at 5 P.M. finished & washed off the
decks wind W.N.W. steering E.N.E.
later Middle under short sail
later under all sail Lat 60° 10' S

Long 68° 49' E
Monday March 5th first part
light winds from W.N.W. steering
E.S.E. under all sail Middle under
double reefs later under all sail
steering S.E. so ends this day
Lat 60° 45' S Long 69° 28' E

Tuesday March 6th first light wind
from W.N.W. steering E.S.E. Middle part
under short sail later part under
all sail steering S.E. by S. Lat 60° 18' S

Long 70° 41' E
Wednesday March 7th first part of this day
light air from W steering E.N.E. under all
sail Middle part under double reefs wind from
N.W. steering to the S.W. by the wind later part
steering S.E. under all sail Lat 60° 05' S

Long 71° 02' E
Thursday March 8th first and Middle part
light air and calm W to S.W. steering from E.S.E. to
S.E. by S at 2 P.M. boarded the W and S boats for
blackfish got two took them to the ship and
commenced cutting off the blubber later boiled
them out the wind S.P.E. to E steering to the
Southward by the wind under all sail

Lat 60° 04' S Long 71° 23' E
Friday March 9th all these 24 hours
light air and calm from S to S.W.
steering on different tacks by the wind
employed in mending the S.P.E. sail &
boiling it so ends Lat 60° 16' S Long 71° 23' E
