sail Middle part steering E. under all sail
last part draw better part steering S. by
N at 10 P.M. made the S of St. Ignace sounds

Sunday March 11th first part steering
S.W. by the wind the wind N.W.
drifts in sight under all sail Middle
part under double reefs the wind
from N.W. to S.W. steering to the N.W. by
the wind latter part under all sail

Monday March 12th first part
good weather and a good breeze from
E. to S.W. steering N.E. by N Middle
under short sail latter under all sail
strong winds from N.W. and rainy
ends this day No obs

Tuesday March 13th first part
strong wind from N.W. steering S.E.
under all sail Middle part took
in the fore sails furled the top sail
& the sail, and hove to under double reef
No wind and fore sail heaving N.W.

After part made all sail the wind
W.N.W. steering to the N. by the wind

Wednesday March 14th first part
light winds from N.W. steering to the
N.W. by the wind Middle part
wind N.W. and squalls steering
S.W. by the wind with the fore sails
clewed down latter part under all
sail and good this day Lat 4.14.9

Long 75.14.4 E

Thursday March 15th first part
light winds from N.W. steering S.W.
Middle under short sail latter
part under all sail ends the 24
hours with some rain Lat 5.14.9 Long 76.14.2 E

Friday March 16th 1838 -
first part light winds from S.W. to
S.W. steering to the S.W. by the wind
under all sail Middle part under
double reefs with rainy weather latter
part made sail squally and rainy
No obs

Saturday 17th first part moderate
wind from S.W. to N. steering on different
tacks by the wind under all sail Middle
part and latter under short sail
plenty of rain No obs

Sunday March 18th first part moderate
wind from S.W. to N. steering on different
tacks by the wind under double reefed fore
sails Middle and latter part steering
moderate and squally weather these 24 hours
No obs

Monday March 19th first part
Middle part moderate winds from
N. to N.W. steering on different tacks
by the wind under all sail latter part
strong winds and squalls from all
quarters employed in making sail
and taking it in again a French
Ship in sight ends this day No obs

Tuesday March 20th first and Middle
part moderate winds from N.W. to S.W.
steering to the Northward and Westward
by the wind latter part under double
reefed top sails latter under all sail

Lat 5.17.9 Long 76.42.0 E

Wednesday March 21st all these 24
hours light winds from S.W. to N. steering
on different tacks by the wind employed
in making out Lat 5.16.8 Long 76.14.2 E
