

Remarks On Board Ship *Jefferson* of Wilmington 296 T.

December 19th 1841 Sunday

At 2 P.M. took out anchor at the mouth of Wilmington Creek and proceeded as far as Reedy Island at 5 P.M. came to at 6 A.M. took out anchor and proceeded down the Bay with winds from N.W. by W. and pleasant

Monday 20th

For part light winds inclines to moderate from S.W. at 5 P.M. discharged our Pilot a light wind from S.W. Cape Henlopen bearing N.W. by S. distant from the light 3 leagues at 6 P.M. doubled reefed the topsails Course S.E. middle fine breeze latter strong breeze and pleasant under single reefed topsails and Courses

Dec - 37.30 - Dec 73.12

Tuesday 21st

For part brisk winds from S.W. by W. and pleasant Course S.E. by E under single reefed topsails and Courses at 6 P.M. doubled reefed the topsails middle part the same latter light winds with a heavy swell from N. set all sail

N. Lat 36.44 Long 69.50 W

Wednesday 22nd

For part brisk winds from N.W. and Cloudy Course S.E. by E all sail set at 5 P.M. stood E.S. doubled reefed the topsails middle part the same with rain latter strong winds from N.W. Course E by S. N. Lat 36.07 Long 66.22 W. Chm

Thursday 23rd

For part strong winds from N.W. under single reefed topsails Course E by S Cloudy weather middle and latter uneven winds from N.W. East headed from S.E. by E. S.E. by E
