Friday 24th

For part strong gale from East a heading to the SE employed in cutting at 6 P.M. saw sperm whales to rigged and to late to leaved middle and latter strong gale with rain

For part light wind and calm employed in stowing spoke London Packet middle and latter fresh wind 3 sail in sight Lat 35.00 Long 159.40

Thursday 2nd

For part strong breeze from S a heading to the East at 6 P.M. went to the SE under double reefed topsail saw a ship a cutting middle and latter light breeze and calm
Lat 35.24 Long 159.00

Friday 3rd

For part calm saw sperm did not get to them middle light winds at 6 A.M. saw more whales leaved and took 1 alongside
Lat 35.20 Long 159.30

Saturday 4th

For part light winds employed in cutting middle and latter the same saw sperm whales Boats of Charing
Lat 35.09 Long 159.30

Sunday 5th

For part light winds employed in Boiling Boats of Charing whales struck a cut the line with second sperm struck an other drew wood middle and latter light winds at 11 A.M. leaved and killed him
