Remarks on board Monday July 25th 1835

These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from E. N. E. and clear all sail set steering S. S. W. by Comp. at 5 P. M. spoke Ship Vespine of Salem No. 61 bound to Pacific Ocean. At sundown took in Top Gall. Sails and Mainwail. Middle light winds at 4 A. M. made all sail. latter part wind hauled to North and light lost sight of the marcella astern so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Tuesday July 26th 1835

These 24 hours commence with light winds from north and clear weather all sail set steering S. S. W. by Compass at 4 P. M. saw a sail standing to the west Middle and latter part weather the same employed in getting rigging making spruceyard &c so ends this day

Remarks on board Wednesday July 27th 1835

These 24 hours commence with light winds from East all sail set steering S. S. W. by Compass. Middle wind and weather the same. At 12 midnight spoke Ship Pictolis of Fairham had taken a small sperm whale. The day beyond latter part some squally. so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Thursday July 28th 1835

All these 24 hours strong trade winds and haze at 10 P. M. took in Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant sails and at 8 A. M. took in Main Top Gallant sail and I spotted saw a Finback whale and many flying fish. At 9 A. M. passed a small rough spot

so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Friday July 29th 1835

All these 24 hours strong trade winds and squally at 7 P. M. took on reef in the Topsails at 10 took in the Mainwail and took another reef in the Fore Topsail. Course S. S. W. by Compass at 5 A. M. shook our reef from the Fore Top a heavy sea on ship telling very much so ends these 24 hours

All these 24 Remarks on board Saturday July 30

All these 24 hours strong trade winds and squally at 7 P. M. double reefed the Fore and Mizzen Topsails and at 5 A. M. let our reef from the same course S. S. W. by compass a heavy sea on board nothing but flying fish

so ends these 24 hours
