 These 24 hours commence with fresh breezes
 from E. E. and smoky weather. At 5 P.M.
 saw a Brigantine standing to the North
 Middle and latter part calm with
 squalls of rain. The English Barge still
 in sight
 Sun Observed
 Latitude by Ac^t 11° 30'
 Longitude " 23° 14'

Remarks on board Sunday August 7. 1835
 These 24 hours commence with calm squally
 weather and heavy rain Middle and latter
 part strong winds from S.W. and squally
 at 2 P.M. took in Topgallant sails saw
 a Ship to the Southward standing by the wind
 to the Eastward. - These 24 hours ends with
 strong winds from E. steering by the wind
 to the E. S. E.
 Latitude Obs 11° 02'
 Longitude by Chron 22° 22'

Remarks on board Monday August 8th 1835
 These 24 hours commence with strong winds
 from S.W. steering by the wind to the
 E. S. E. Middle light winds and clear head
 up E. E. set the Topgallant sails at 10 P.M.
 Two Barges and one Ship in sight working
 to the Southward employed in fanning sails
 Latitude by Obs 10° 51'
 Longitude by Chron 20° 59'

towards the South Atlantic Whaling Thomas Howland Master
 Remarks on board Tuesday August 9th 1835
 These 24 hours commence with light breezes and
 hazy Middle calm with heavy rain accompani
 with sharp lightning and heavy thunder took
 in sail latter part light air and hazy
 with rain at 6 P.M. made all sail. - Seven
 sail of ships in sight
 Sun Observed
 Latitude by Ac^t 10° 25'

Remarks on board Wednesday August 10. 1835
 These 24 hours commence with light air and
 hazy at 6 P.M. a light breeze from S.W.
 all drawing sail set standing by the wind
 S.W. by Compass. - Middle and latter
 light breezes and clear - At 6 P.M. saw a
 Ship to the Westward with the loss of main
 mast below the Top - five sail in sight
 to day
 Latitude by Obs 9° 54'
 Longitude by Chron 20° 35'

Remarks on board Thursday August 11. 1835
 These 24 hours commence with light winds
 from S.W. standing by the wind to the S.W. E.
 Middle calm with squalls of rain accompanied
 with lightning and thunder took in Topgallant
 sails latter part light winds from S.W.
 and fine at 2 P.M. set the Topgallant sails
 Ten Ships in sight standing to the South
 Latitude by Obs 9° 21'
 Longitude by Chron 20° 04'
