 Latitude by Obs 35 54
 Longitude by Chron 15 10

Remarks on board Sunday Sept 18.
 These 24 hours commence with a Gale
 from W N W and clear weather steering
 to the S E under double reef Main Topsail
 and Foresail at 4 P M gave her to
 under storm sails from 4 to 8 a
 heavy Gale the wind then changed to
 S W and moderate latter part light
 winds all sail set steering S E.

 Longitude by Chron 14 14

Remarks on board Monday Sept 19.
 These 24 hours commence with calm clear
 weather - Middle light winds from
 S N E - latter part strong winds
 and thick rainy weather Ship gave her
 heading to the S W saw nothing
 Then Observed

 These 24 hours commence with a Gale
 from S N E and sailing ship under
 storm sails heading to the S W at
 4 P M wind changed to S N W gave
 ship to the S E - Middle and latter
 part strong Gale and rainy -
 Latitude by Obs 35 26
 Longitude by Chron 13 00

Remarks on board Wednesday Sept 21.
 These 24 hours commence with a Gale from
 S and sailing ship under storm sails
 heading to the East - Middle
 the same - at 2 P M wind changed
 to S W and squally latter part more
 moderate set the Foresail - at 12 N gave
 ship to the South - saw no fish -
 Latitude by Obs 36 08
 Longitude by Chron 12 00

Remarks on board Thursday Sept 22.
 These 24 hours commence with strong winds
 from W S W at 2 P M set double reef
 Topsails Gibby and Mainmast - Middle
 light winds from W N W at 10 P M were
 ship to the S - at 6 A M saw the Island
 of Tristan da Cunha bearing S W distant
 15 leagues gave ship to the South west all
 sail set - latter part squally look in sail
 at noon Island bore S W distant 20 miles
 saw Blackbird and one Frigate
 Latitude by Obs 36 47
 Longitude by Chron 11 58
