Remarks on board Sunday October 9
These 24 hours commence with light
winds from S.W. and clear pleasant
weather all sail set steering to the S.E.
Middle thick rain rather latter part
light breeze from S.W. and clear saw
nothing but Finbacky and Birds -
Latitude by Obs 32° 10'
Longitude - 9° 15'

Remarks on board Monday Oct 10
These 24 hours commence with light
winds from S.W. and clear all sail set
steering to the S.E. Middle thick cloudy
weather latter part light winds from S.W.
and squally a bright look out next day
saw no Fish -
Latitude 33° 04'
Longitude 11° 10'
