These 24 hours commence with a Gale  
from NW ship under double reef Main  
Topsail and Foresail heaved to the  
NNE - Middle more moderate latter  
part strong breezes from WNW  
stirring by the wind to the N under  
single reef Topsails saw many Finbacks  
and Humpbacks

Latitude  $34^{\circ} 55'$

Longitude  $4^{\circ} 27'$

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 5.

These 24 hours commence with light  
winds from WNW and smoky all  
sail set stirring by the wind to the  
North - Middle mainly calm latter  
part strong winds from NNE  
and heavy sea stirring by the wind  
to the west saw Finbacks -

Latitude  $35^{\circ} 00'$

Longitude  $3^{\circ} 25'$

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 6.

These 24 hours commence with strong wind  
from N stirring to the W under double  
reef Topsails - Middle squally with  
rain at 1 PM furled the Main sail  
at 2 wind changed to WNW soon ship  
to the NNE at 6 AM let out reef from  
the Topsails and set the Main sail and  
jib saw Finbacks -

Longitude  $2^{\circ} 10'$

South Atlantic for Whales Thomas Howland Master 1835  
Remarks on board Monday Nov 7. 1835

These 24 hours commence with light winds  
from NW and clear all sail set stirring  
by the wind to the WNW - Middle calm  
at 1 PM light breeze from ENE set the  
Fore Topsail standing sail course W by N  
by compass saw a ship stirring to the west  
and stayed at mauling in old Boat -  
saw Finbacks

Latitude  $35^{\circ} 05'$

Longitude  $1^{\circ} 45'$  East

Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 8. 1835

These 24 hours commence with light winds  
from NNE and cloudy all sail set stirring  
W by N by compass at 2 PM wind heaved  
to N took in the standing sail - Middle strong  
winds and heavy at 8 PM took in Top  
Gallant Sails - latter part strong winds and  
thick weather at 10 PM took in the jib  
and double reefed the Topsails - at 11 AM  
saw a Brig standing to the East saw Humpbacks  
and Finbacks

Latitude by Acct.  $35^{\circ} 20'$

Longitude -  $00^{\circ} 40'$  W

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 9. 1835

These 24 hours commence with strong gale  
from N at 1 PM took in the Main sail and  
close reefed the Topsails - at 8 PM took  
in the Fore and Mizzen Topsails and  
at 9 took in the Foresail at 10 wind  
changed to NW and rising soon ship to the  
NNE - latter part more moderate moderate  
this day with strong winds from  
NW stirring by the wind to the WNW  
under single reef Topsails saw no fish

Longitude  $2^{\circ} 20'$
