

Remarks on board Ship John Cruising in the South

Remarks on board Monday Nov 28

These 24 hours commence with a Gale from S.W. & rain. Main Toppails and Forepails hauled to the S.W. Middle the same at 5 P.M. saw the Island of Tristan da Cunha bearing W. & W. distant 15 leagues. - Latter part light windy and falling all sail set working to the westward.

Latitude $37^{\circ} 13'$

Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 29

These 24 hours commence with light winds from S.W. all sail set by the wind to the S.W. - Middle squally clouds raised the Toppails. Latter part strong windy and cloudy but the rips from the Toppails the Island of Tristan da Cunha bearing S. distant 15 leagues - carrying sail night and day to get to the westward.

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 30

These 24 hours commence with fresh wind from S.W. and cloudy all sail set by the wind to the S.W. - Middle the same at 9 P.M. took in Top Gallen sails at 4 P.M. wind S. & E. at 7 took one reef in the Toppails at 9 clouds raised and took in gills and mainsail at 11 tumbled the Fore and Mizzen Toppails and close reefed the main ends with a Gale from S. and rain.

Remarks on board Thursday December 1

These 24 hours commence with a Gale from S. and rain. Ship under close reef. Main Toppails hauled to the west - Middle the same at 7 P.M. wore ship to the S.E. at 10 wind changed to S.W. and squally - at 5 P.M. wind hauled to West at 10 moderate made sail stuning by the wind to the South - saw many Birds but no Whales.

Remarks on board Friday Dec 2

These 24 hours commence with light winds from W. all sail set stuning by the wind to the South at 5 P.M. wind changed to S.W. tacked to the S.W. - Middle and latter part strong windy from S.W. stuning by the wind to the West - at 5 P.M. saw a sail standing to the W. saw no Whales - employed at landing some

Remarks on board Saturday Dec 3. 1855

These 24 hours commence with strong winds from S. stuning by the wind to the W. at 4 P.M. closed reefed the Toppails at 6 took in gills and mainsail and at 7 took in fore and Mizzen Toppails close reefed the main and furlled the Forepails - Middle a very heavy Gale with rain - at 1 P.M. wore ship to the East on account of the sea - Latter part main moderate set the Forepails
