 saw no Whales. Ship now too head-
 ed to the S.W.

 All these 24 hours a Gale from S.W.
 and thick weather ship now too on different
 tacks - at 1 P.M. again commenced sailing
 saw no Whales but Finbacks.

Remarks on Board Sunday Jan 29
 These 24 hours commence with light
 wind from S.W. and cloudy at 1 P.M.
 kept her E.S.E. and made all sail -
 Middle calm and raining - at 4 P.M.
 wind S.E. latter part strong wind
 and clear weather all sail set by the
 wind to the East saw no Whales.

Remarks on Board Monday Feb 5 - 1837
 These 24 hours commence with a strong
 wind from S.W. and cloudy all sail
 set to the S.E. at 4 P.M. saw one
 right Whale toward the Boat and the
 M. Boat took him to the ship and cut
 him in. latter part a Gale from S.W.
 and thick weather ship now too to the
 S.W. commenced sailing.

Remarks on Board Monday Feb 6 -
 These 24 hours commence with a Gale
 from S.W. and thick weather ship now
 too - Middle and latter part light
 wind from S.W. and cloudy all sail
 set to the E.S.E. saw no Whales -
 employed at sailing.

Latitude 40° 58'

Remarks on Board Tuesday Feb 7 - 1837
 These 24 hours commence with light wind
 from S.W. and cloudy all sail set stung
 E.S.E. by compass at 1 P.M. finished
 sailing at 4 saw one right Whale going
 quick chased without success - at night
 took in sail and hauled by the wind to
 the South - latter part strong wind
 from W. and squally stung E.S.E.
 under short sail employed at
 staving off.
