Return sailing a 60 fms Wharf
at 2 AM finished sailing

These 24 hours light wind and
sailing saw no Wharf - Ship Good Return
in light

These 24 hours commence with a
calm - Middle strong wind from S
later part a Gale and squally -
Ship how too to the W under close
reef M Topsail and Maysail -

These 24 hours a Gale from S E
Ship how too on different tack
at 6 PM passed a Ship of War sailing
to the S showed the British Ensign

These 24 hours a Gale from S E and
squally Ship how too on different tack
under close reef M Topsail and Maysail
Tonsail

later part moderate set double reef
Topsails gibs and Sails

Remarks on Board Monday June 6

These 24 hours commence with
strong wind from S and all sail set
to the W - later part the same
ship under short sail by the wind
to the W

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 6

These 24 hours commence with strong
wind from S and steering to the W under
close reef Topsails & later part
a Gale from S ship how too to the
E sails a Ship to the leeward

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 7

These 24 hours commence with a
Gale from S ship how too to the E
Middle the same - later part more
moderate steering by the wind to the
S W under double reef on ship in
light

Remarks on Board Thursday June 8

These 24 hours commence with strong
wind from S E and rough sea -
later part light wind from E and
fine weather all sail set to the S W
at 6 PM spoke Ship Ann Parry of Port
5 months out 90 lbs oil

Remarks on Board Friday June 9 - 1837

These 24 hours fresh wind from S E and
sea all sail set on different tack
at 7 PM saw 3 small Whales going quick to
the windward chased without success

These 24 hours commence with light
wind from S and sea all set on
different tack - later part squally
saw many Blackfish
