 steering S.E. under double reef Topsails
 latter part rain saw no Whales
 ship Zephyr in sight
 Latitude 36° 02'

 from S. steering by the wind to the E. at 5
 A.M. wind changed to E backed to the S.
 saw a ship standing to the N. no Whales
 Latitude 35° 50'

 Remarks on board Wednesday Sept 20
 These 24 hours strong breeze from N. and
 pleasant weather all sail set to the S.E.
 took in sail at night as usual saw no
 Whales at 6 P.M. spoke ship Zephyr had
 seen no Whales Latitude 35° 30'
 Longitude 50° 30'

Remarks on board Thursday Sept 21 1837
 All these 24 hours strong wind from N.W.
 steered S.E. till 5 P.M. saw nothing then
 hauled by the wind to the S.E. latter
 part strong steering by the wind to the S.E.
 under double reef Topsails saw one Finback
 Latitude 35° 50'
 Longitude 52° 11'

Remarks on board Friday Sept 22
 These 24 hours commenced with strong
 wind from N.W. and clear steering by
 the wind to the S.E. under double reef
 Topsails at 5 P.M. kept the S. and
 took in Fore and Mizzen Topsails, middle
 and latter part strong wind and thick
 weather steering S. under double reef Topsails
 saw no Whales
 Sun Obscured
 Lat by Acc^t 37° 00'
 Long " 53° 00'

Remarks on board Saturday Sept 23
 These 24 hours commenced with strong
 wind from N.W. and thick weather steering
 S. under double reef Topsails at 5 P.M.
 bore too to the S.W. middle and latter
 part a Gale with rain at 8 A.M.
 wore ship to the S.E. saw nothing
 Latitude 37° 51'
 Longitude 53° 40'
