These 24 hours commenced with a Gale
from W and rain ship's home too to
the S Middle and latter part more
moderate at 5 A M set double reef
Top sail and stowed S E saw nothing
Latitude 37° 48'
Longitude 64° 20'

Remarks on Board Monday Sept 25
These 24 hours commenced with strong wind
from N storm S E Middle and latter part
a strong Gale from S W ship's home too to
the S E saw nothing Latitude 37° 24'
Longitude 65° 15'

Remarks on Board Tuesday Sept 26
These 24 hours commenced with a heavy
Gale from S W ship's home too to the S E
under close reef N Top sail and staysail
Middle more moderate latter part light
wind from S W and heavy swell rising
to the S E employed at unhooking new
sail and hauling old one saw one
Finback
Latitude 36° 20'
Longitude 66° 20'

Remarks on Board Wednesday Sept 27
These 24 hours commenced with strong
wind from S W Middle a Gale with
rain ship's home too to the S E at 10 A M
wind changed to S W lowering a Gale
and squally saw no Whales ship
Yepays in sight Latitude 35° 58'
Longitude 66° 30'

Remarks on Board Sunday Nov 19

These 24 hours commenced with strong
wind from S and rain at 2 P M
saw one Whale and the S Boat took
him to the ship latter part strong
wind and crew employed at cutting
Latitude 35° 15'
Longitude 68° 15'

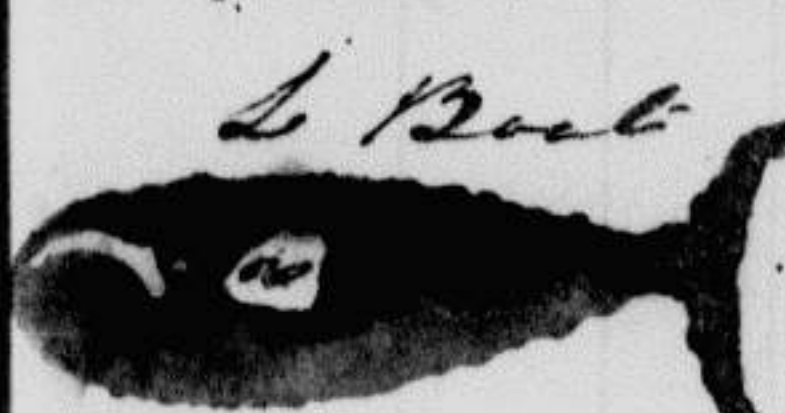
Remarks on Board Monday Nov 20 - 1837
These 24 hours commenced with strong
wind from S Middle calm latter
part light wind from S and crew
employed at tacking and stowing A B
saw Whales and took one to the Foreland Boat
Latitude 35° 05'

Remarks on Board Tuesday Nov 21
These 24 hours commenced with strong
wind from S and steady Middle
a Gale and rain at 10 P M cooled
down the works on account of the
weather latter part wind and weather
the same saw several Whales
Latitude 35° 25'
Longitude 65° 00'

Remarks on Board Wednesday Nov 22
These 24 hours commenced with
a Gale from S W and rain Middle
and latter part strong wind from S W
employed at tacking saw Whales to
the windward Latitude 34° 58'

Remarks on Board Thursday Nov 23
These 24 hours strong wind from S W
and steady at 5 P M lowered and
took two Whales one to the Foreland
and one to the Waist Boat latter part
employed at cutting saw many Whales
Latitude 35° 00'
Longitude 66° 10'

Remarks on Board Friday Nov 24 - 1837
These 24 hours strong wind from S W
saw Whales and rain employed at tacking and
dressing up Pipes View Obscure
