Remarks on board Wednesday Jan 3-1838
 These 24 hours commenced with strong wind
 from N.W. steering by the wind to the N.E.
 under single reef Topsails - Middle and
 latter part light air from E. all sail
 set course W by N by compass employed at
 getting rigging &c. Latitude 34° 07'
 Longitude 29° 29'

Remarks on board Thursday Jan 4-

These 24 hours commenced with light
 air from S.E. and clear - Middle calm
 with lightning and thunder - latter part
 light breeze from S. all sail set steering
 W by compass. Found a small current
 setting to the N.W. Latitude 34° 25'
 Longitude 28° 40'

Remarks on board Friday Jan 5-1838

These 24 hours commenced with light wind
 from S.E. and clear all sail set course W
 by compass - at 4 P.M. passed a ship
 steering to the S.E. also saw a ship steer-
 ing directly after us - middle wind S.E.
 and squally - at 8 A.M. hauled to W
 and strong took in sail to double reef
 Topsails by the wind to the S.
 Latitude 35° 20'
 Longitude 27° 16'

Remarks on board Saturday Jan 6-1838

These 24 hours strong Gale from W steering
 by the wind to the S.W. under close reef
 Topsails - at 7 P.M. wore ship to the S.
 Middle heavy Gale and heavy squally
 at 10 took in Main and Mizzen Topsails and
 Fore-sail - latter part moderated a little at
 7 A.M. wind W.W. wore to the S.W. - at 10
 set close reef Topsails - and still in sight
 Latitude 35° 48'
 Longitude 27° 05'

Remarks on board Sunday Jan 7-

These 24 hours strong wind from W and
 very squally steering by the wind on different
 tack under close reef Topsails and Fore-sail
 saw plenty of Whales but no Whales
 Latitude 36° 12'
 Longitude 26° 45'

Remarks on board Monday Jan 8-

These 24 hours commenced with strong wind
 from W steering by the wind to the S. under
 double reef - at 8 P.M. let out the reef -
 Middle wind W.S.W. - at 10 P.M. hauled
 to the S.W. - latter part strong wind and
 heavy sea at 10 A.M. double reef
 Latitude 37° 15'
 Longitude

Remarks on board Tuesday Jan 9-

These 24 hours commenced with strong
 wind from W.S.W. and heavy sea steering by
 the wind to the S.W. - at 8 P.M. wind hauled
 to W.S.W. and squally wore ship to the S.W.
 latter part strong Gale and heavy squally
 at 6 A.M. close reef the Topsails and
 reef the Main-sail
 Found a strong current Latitude 36° 50'
 setting S.E. Longitude 26° 50'
