Saturday December 5th 1857

This day Comes in with fine Weather and moderate trades the Ship steering S.W. by Compass with fore topmast standing sail set, middle and latter part latter moderate trades. Employed to work on rigging saw a vessel steering to the Northward saw no fish of any description.

Sunday December 6th

Comes in with fine Weather and moderate trades the Ship steering S.W. Middle and latter part the wind fell to the eastward saw porpoises and other small fry a sail in sight steering to the Northward

Lat 11.20 S Long by Lunar 34.30
Long by Chron 34.32

Monday Dec 7th

This day fine Weather and moderate trade Winds the Ship steering S.W. saw porpoises, Employed seizing off the main rigging, ends with very light trades.

Lat 13.51 S Long by Lunar 34.30
Long by Chron 34.13

Tuesday Dec 8th

First part fresh trades and clear Weather the Ship steering S.W. saw nothing Employed seizing off the main rigging saw three or four sailings and ends with light trades.

Lat 15.20 S Long 36.00 W

Wednesday Dec 9th

Comes in with light trades the Bark steering S.W. at sunset shortened sail middle and latter part light trades, Employed turning in the fore rigging breaking out in the after hold and sundry ways, saw several vessels,

Lat 16.30 S Long 36.20 W

Thursday Dec 10th

First part light trades and variable the Ship steering to the South at sunset shortened sail middle and latter part much the same Employed turning in the main rigging saw several vessels

Friday Dec 11th 1857

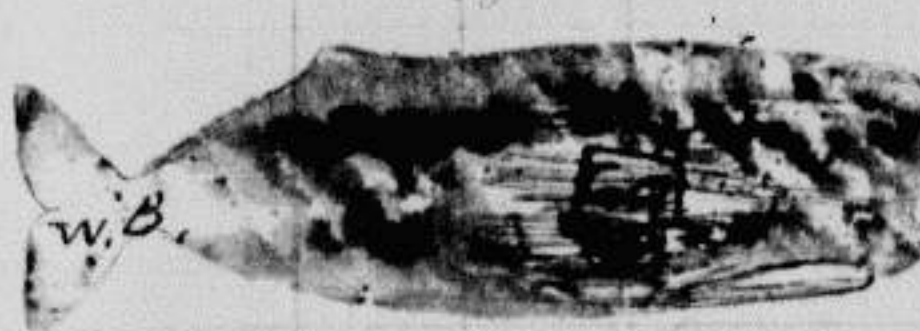
Fine Weather and moderate trades the Ship steering to the Southward several vessels in sight steering to the Northward, saw no fish of any description. The Watch Employed setting up the main topmast rigging latter part rainy

Notes —

Saturday Dec 12th

This day fine Weather and moderate Breezes from the Eastward the Ship steering Southward Employed breaking out in the fore hold one vessel in sight so ends with fine Weather

Lat 17.00 S Long 36.00 W



Sunday Dec 13th

Comes in with fine Weather and moderate trades the Ship steering to the South Middle and latter part much the same at 5 A.M. saw Whales lowered but could not get fast the Whales saw the Boat, returned on Board and hoisted the Boats, about Noon lowered again. Waist Boat struck and killed a Whale and took him alongside.

Lat 20.00 S Long 36.00 W

Monday Dec 14th

Comes in with fine Weather the Ship heading to the South all hands Employed cutting in finished about 11 A.M. middle and latter part Employed Boiling several vessels in sight saw a small Breeze several times but could not make out what they were

Lat 20.51 S Long 36.50 W

Tuesday Dec 15th

These twenty four hours show Breezes from E.S.E. the Bark on the Eastern Tacks Middle and latter part rainy and squally, saw one or two vessels. all hands Employed Boiling.

No Obs.

Wednesday Dec 16th

This day Comes in with fresh trades the Ship steering to the South Employed Boiling saw nothing finished Boiling about 4 P.M. and washed off the Decks. Middle and latter part Employed cooping one man off Duty with a lame foot but with a learning knife

Lat 22.11 S Long 36.59
