

Bark Steamer A. Robt of Fairhaven Capt Baker

Tuesday Feb 23rd 1858

Comes in with fine Weather and fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. the Ship steering to the N. E. by the Wind saw several Merchant vessels steering to the Westward Lat 26.55 Long 47.08 E

Wednesday Feb 24th

These twenty four hours fresh Breezes and Cloudy Weather the Bark working to windward saw fin backs, several vessels in sight, ends with squally Weather Lat 26.36 Long 47.18 E

Thursday Feb 25th

Comes in with fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. the Bark working to windward under double reef. Saw nothing but fin backs ends with fine clear Weather Lat 25.00 Long 48.48 E

Friday Feb 26th

These twenty four hours fresh Breezes and clear Weather the Bark working to windward under short sail saw fin backs and plenty of Birds Lat 25.08 Long 48.48 E

Saturday Feb 27th

Comes in with fine Weather and strong Breezes from N. E. the Bark steering to the N. E. by the Wind latter part steering to the Southward saw nothing Lat 24.58 Long 48.15 E

Sunday Feb 28th

These twenty four hours fresh Breezes from N. E. the Bark steering the South East by the Wind latter part steering N. E. Lat 24.58 Long 48.15 E

Monday March 1st 1858

Comes in with fresh Breezes from N. E. the Bark steering the middle part squally latter part rain and a heavy swell from the S. E. lying to under two close reefed topsails saw nothing Lat No obs

Tuesday March 2nd

This day Comes in with fresh Breezes from the N. E. the Bark steering to the S. E. under short sail saw nothing Lat 25.41 Long 48.15 E

Bark Steamer C. Robt. Cruising on Madagascar

Wednesday March 3rd 1858

Comes in with squally Weather and fresh Breezes from N. W. S. W. the Bark working to windward under easy sail saw nothing latter part more moderate made all sail the first time for one week Lat 24.37 Long 48.51 E

Thursday March 4th

These twenty four hours fine Weather and moderate Breeze from S. W. saw nothing middle part calm latter part light air from South at 10 A. M. saw the Land bearing N. W. 1/2 W. 45 miles Dist, Lat 24.46 Long 47.45 E

Friday March 5th

These twenty four hours strong Breezes from S. E. the Bark steering N. E. 1/2 W. the Land in sight bearing N. E. 1/2 W. at sunset shortened sail and hauled to the wind to the Southward at daylight steered of N. E. 1/2 W. saw no fish

Saturday March 6th

Comes in with strong Breeze from the North East the Ship steering to the Northward middle and latter part fine Weather at noon Cape St Marys bearing N. E. 1/2 E Lat 25.44 Long 47.20 E

Sunday March 7th

Comes in with fine Weather and fresh Breeze from N. E. the Bark steering N. E. for Augustine Bay at 8 A. M. passed Sandy Island ends with fresh Breeze off shore beating up to the Anchorage

Monday March 8th

Comes in with strong Breeze from N. E. the Bark steering to the Anchorage at 2 P. M. came to anchor in 12 fathoms and furled the sails latter part took in a raft of bark and filled them

Tuesday March 9th

This day wind from the Westward and raining nearly all day and very rough so we could not get our raft

Wednesday March 10th

Employed getting off water and storing it down got off about 20 lbs of Biscuits some beans & other articles

Thursday March 11th

This day fine Weather and light Breezes employed getting off water got a raft of 80 lbs of water
