

Bark John. A. Kibb. Cruising off New Holland

Saturday June 19th 1858

This day comes in with fresh Breezes from S.E. the Bark steering to the N. Middle and latter part much the same. Saw nothing but finbacks.

Lat 23.19 Long 108.21



Sunday June 20th

This day comes in with fresh Breezes from S.E. the Bark steering to the N. Middle and latter part much the same at 2 P.M. saw Whales going to windward lowerd three Boats the Waist Boat picked one but did not get fast, latter part working to windward looking for the Whales but could not find them. So ends with fine Weather and fresh breezes

Lat 23.24 Long 107.35

Monday June 21st

Comes in with fresh breezes from S.E. steering by the wind to the N. at 2 P.M. tacked to the S.W. middle and latter part strong breeze and rain. latter part saw plenty of finbacks. the Bark Belle in company.

Tuesday June 22^d

These twenty four hours fine Weather and light Breezes from S.E. the Bark standing to the Southward the Belle in company saw finbacks and other small fgy. Ends with light breeze.

Lat 23.00. Long 108.07

Wednesday June 23^d

First part. fine Weather and moderate Breezes the Bark standing to the Westward at Sunset wore round to the N.E. middle and latter part, good whole sail breeze saw finbacks

Lat 23.29 Long 108.22

Thursday June 24th

This day comes in with fresh breezes and squally weather the Bark standing to the N.W. at 6 P.M. sent a boat on board of a Danish Bark, bound to Angier point, from Adelaide, Australia, and got some English paper from her. latter part light breezes and cloudy Weather. Saw nothing of the Whale kind

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Friday June 25th 1858

This day comes in with fresh breeze from S.S.W. the Ship steering N.E. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Middle and latter part much the same. Employed repairing old fore topsail. Saw finbacks.

Lat 21.55. Long 107.25

Saturday June 26th

Comes in with fresh breezes from S.W. the Bark standing to the S.E. Middle and latter part much the same. Saw finbacks, and other small fgy. the watch employed repairing and old fore topsail, that the sail makers overlooked while at home, accidentally I suppose finished it but it. Steered the other away to repair at leisure

Lat 22.05. Long 108.19

Sunday June 27th

These twenty four hours fresh breezes from S.S.W. steering by the Wind to the Westward. two vessels in sight, also several finbacks. Ends with fine Weather and clear sky.

Lat 22.47 Long 108.07

Monday June 28th

Comes in with fresh breezes from S.W. the Bark standing by the wind to the Westward at Sunset tacked to the Eastward. middle and latter part moderate. Saw several vessels, spoke the Bark Mars, about 10 A.M. So ends with fine Weather. Several finbacks in sight

Lat 23.10 Long 107.43

Tuesday June 29th

Comes in with light breezes from the Southward, the Bark standing to the Eastward middle part nearly calm. the Bark Mars in sight steering to the N.E. saw several finbacks and grampuses.

Lat 22.34 Long 108.00

Wednesday June 30th

All these twenty four hours light breezes from S.E. the Bark steering to the N.E. middle and latter part nearly calm, saw plenty of finbacks and grampuses. lowered one Boat for a Sulphur Bottom and tried to shoot him, but did not succeed. the Watch employed scraping Ship on the outside. and painting. ends with light air from South

Lat 22.38 Long 108.38
