Wednesday Dec 5th 1860

These twenty four hours fresh Breezes from E. N.E.
Steering W. Middle and latter part much the same
Saw nothing. The watch Employed Working on the
Rigging. The Sick men are improving some but not
very fast

Lat 28.20 Long 37.58

Thursday Dec 6th 1860

This day fresh Breezes from N.E. The Bark Steering
West. with fore top mast & dory sail set, Middle and
latter part much the same. Saw nothing
Capt Baker Sick again.

No obs.

Friday Thursday Dec 7th

Comes in with strong Easterly winds the Bark
steering W. Middle part squally & rainy Ends
with fine weather Saw nothing. Ends

Lat 30.18 Long 33.30

Saturday Dec 8th

These twenty four hours fine weather
and moderate Breezes steering from E. to S.W.
The Course W.S.W. Ends with rainy weather

Lat 32.08 Long

Sunday Dec 9

Comes in with fine weather and moderate
Breeze from the North. Middle part veering
to the Westward. Ends with fresh Breezes
from the Westward

Lat 33.04 Long 30.00

Monday Dec 10th

Comes in with fresh Gale from the West
the Bark heading to the North Middle
part blowing quite fresh Laying to
under Close reefed main top sail and reefed
foresail at 2 P.M. took in the foresail. Latter
part moderate, a Ship in Sight Lat 32.58 Long 29

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Tuesday Dec 11th 1860

This day Comes in with moderate Breeze
from the Eastward. The Bark Steering W. by S
Middle and latter part much the same one
Ship in Sight. Saw porpoises and one Jackback
Wm Stevens & James Nichols, are getting a little better
Capt Baker is a little better also.

Lat 33.58 Long 28.11

Wednesday Dec 12th

These twenty four hours moderate wind and
variable The Bark Steering W. by North. Saw
two vessels, one bound South the other N.E.

Lat 34.33 Long 26.20

Thursday Dec 13th

First part light variable winds the Bark
heading to the Westward. Middle part the
Wind veering to the Eastward. Saw nothing
Ends with strong Easterly winds. at noon
Saw the land bearing N.W.

Lat 35.33 Long 24.41

Friday Dec 14th

These twenty four hours fine weather and fresh
Breeze from the Eastward the Bark heading N.W.
Middle part wind from S.E. veering to the South latter
part wind South. Several vessels in Sight. The Legend
in Sight bearing N.W.

Lat 35.04 Long 21.14

Saturday Dec 15th

Comes in with fine weather and moderate winds
from S.W. at 1 P.M. saw the land off the lee beam
bearing about N.W. Ends with strong S.E. winds

Lat 33.00 Long 19.00

Sunday Dec 16th

First part strong S.E. Gale the Bark Steering
N.W. by N for Cape Horn. at sunset heaved
to the Wind heading to the S.W. at day light
steered of N.E. for Table Bay. Run down
to the entrance of the Harbour and stood out
again as it was blowing too hard to anchor without endangering
the Bark
