Sunday Feb. 24th

Come in with fine weather and moderate trades the Bark steering by the Wind on different tacks Middle and latter part squally. Saw nothing of importance
Lat 17.35 S Long 146 W

Monday Feb. 25th
First part of this day fine weather and fresh trades the Bark steering S.W. by W. Middle part the Wind variable. Ends with steady trades. Saw nothing but porpoises and other small fry
Lat 17.35 S Long 146 W

Tuesday Feb. 26th
Come in with moderate Breezes from the S.E. the Bark steering S.W. by S. Middle part the weather about the same Ends with fine weather. Two Merchantsmen in sight steering off to the Northward at 3 P.M. Saw the Island of St Helena, being N. about 40 miles
Lat 16.42 S Long 146.58 W

Wednesday Feb. 27th
Come in with fresh Breezes from S.E. the Bark steering S.W. by S. at sunset luffed to the Wind. Middle part tacked to the Eastward at 10 A.M. tacked to the S.W. Saw several vessels. The Island in sight 30 miles.
Lat 16.41 S Long 146.54 W

Thursday Feb. 28th
These twenty four hours fine weather and moderate Winds from the S.E. the Bark on different tacks. Middle and latter part fresh Trades. Saw Merchantsmen. Lat 16.25 S Long 146.43 W

Friday March 1st
First part of this day Good weather and moderate Winds from the S.E. the Bark heading to the N.E. at sunset luffed to the Wind heading to the S.W. latter part steering for the Island at noon the Island bearing N. 23 miles

Saturday March 2nd 1861.

This day Come in with fine weather and moderate Trades. the Bark heading on different tack, middle and latter part the weather about the same. Saw a few ships but fish of no kind. at noon the Island bearing about North 35 miles Dist.

Sunday March 3rd
This day Come in with fine weather and good Whalesail breezes from the Southward. the Bark standing to the S.W. Middle and latter part the weather about the same. latter part steering to the N.E. Saw several vessels. but no fish. The Island bearing N.W. E. at noon about 35 miles

Monday March 4th
First part of this day Good weather and moderate Breezes from the S.E. the Bark steering to the S.E. at sunset tacked to the S.W. Middle and latter part much the same. Ends with light breezes. Employed mending the Spanker.
Lat 16.42 S Long 146.58 W

Tuesday March 5th
This day fresh trades the Bark on different tacks. Saw nothing but a few vessels steering of before the Wind. The Watch repairing the Foresail
Lat 16.30 S Long 146.40 W

Wednesday March 6th
Come in with fresh trades and squally weather the Bark steering to the S.W. Middle part the weather about the same. Ends with moderate Trades steering for the Island. Saw nothing at noon the Island bearing N. 25 miles
