

Sunday June 9th 1867
Fine weather a good breeze from NW
Ship heading SE
Lat 34° 29' N Long 44° 47' W

Monday June 10th
First fair fine weather, with a light wind
from W. Heading SE. Sunset took in sail
Lat 34° 35' N Long 44° 27' W

Tuesday June 11th
This day fine weather, with a light wind from
W. Heading SW. Sunset took in sail
Lat 34° 04' N Long 43° 20' W

Wednesday June 12th
This day fresh breeze, steering NE and N
Picked up a plank. At sunset shortened sail
Lat 36° 04' N Long 43° 05' W

Thursday June 13th
Fine weather with a good breeze, at 2 P.M.
squally. At 4 P.M. took in foretop sail. At sunset
fueled the forecail. Heading SE
Lat 37° 05' N Long 42° 05' W

Wednesday June 17th
Commenced fine, with a stiff breeze from NE
steering by the wind on
the Starboard tack
At 5 A.M. Mr. Reed
raised a school of sperm
whales, 2 points on the lee bow, going to Northward
lowered for them, and starboard. Boat got one.
Commenced cutting at 7:30 A.M. finished
at 9 P.M.
Lat 37° 30' N Long 39° 20' W

Thursday June 20th 1867
Commenced fine, with a light breeze from NE
steering by the wind on the starboard tack
Commenced tying out at 7 A.M. Engaged
at cutting furk and flukes in horse pieces

Friday June 21st
Commenced fine, with a light wind from South
steering by the wind. Engaged at tying out
about four sails

Saturday June 22nd
Commenced fine, with a light from South
Engaged in boiling our whale, we will finish
this evening

Sunday June 23rd
Weather pleasant, with a light breeze from the
NW. Steering full and by. At 1 P.M. lowered
the waistcoat and went aboard the English
brig Orlando of Jersey, Eng. from Rio Grande bound
to Falmouth. Capt. Hicks and some of the
officers sent letters by her for home, via England

Sunday June 30th
Weather fine in the A.M. with a stiff breeze
from W. steering E. P.M. wind kept increasing
At 2 P.M. fueled the main sail, raised a sail
4 points on the starboard bow. we hauled on
the wind and stood for, and proved to be a
English bark, exchanged Longitude with her
3 P.M. put a reef in the foretop sail. at 4 P.M.
one in the maintop sail. Yesterday hove out
fore and aft and cooped our head and fluke
ge, also lowered for a school of Humpbacks but they
were going to quick. At sunset shortened sail
and hauled aboard the mainyard.
Lat 37° 05' N Long 36° 25' W
