

Thursday August 6th 1867
 Weather fine, wind light from W. Steering S
 Sent the Studding sail hoist aloft, set the sails
 Also bent the maintopmast stay sail, maintop gallant
 and mizen topmast stay sails. 6 PM sent the royals
 and yards aloft

Friday August 7th
 Weather fine, with a light wind from SW steering
 full and by. Breeze yesterday and the day before
 making a catch of Mangrove signals, Larva grampus
 and a sail this A.M. Have been on the starboard
 tack ever since we left the Islands, and had light
 winds the whole time Lat 31° 38' N

Saturday August 12th
 Weather fine, with a strong breeze from NE course
 SSW struck in the NE trades at 7 A.M. Have
 got all sail out, except the royals which we carry night
 Lat 29° 50' N

Sunday August 14th
 Weather cloudy, with a strong breeze from NE course.
 One of the pigs died today. Lat 22° 50' N

Monday August 15th
 Fair, moderate wind from NE steering SSW. Set
 up the mizen fore and aft stays, maintop gallant
 and royal backstays Lat 19° 30' N

Tuesday August 16th
 Fair, wind light from NE course S by W. saw one sail
 this morning, and grampus and pinbacks this
 afternoon. Another pig died today
 Lat 17° 50' N

Wednesday August 17th 1867
 Squally with fair wind light from E. steering full
 and by. This morning the Capt went aboard of the
 French bark L'Amour of M. Kersilles bound to Rio Grande.
 Four sails in sight this evening. did not set the royals
 this evening Lat 13° 35' N

Thursday August 20th
 Fair, with light squally wind and rain. Course S
 lowered about noon the Bow Port for a school of
 Alperines and got one. Saw ten sails all merchantmen
 Lat 12° 10' N Long 24° 34' W

Friday August 27th
 Fair, moderate wind from SE. steering SW. Have
 had a great deal of squally weather previous to this
 and wind strong from SW. Saw one sail on the
 weather quarter this morning. Raised Black fish this
 evening and lowered three boats for them. but did
 not see them again

Lat 6° 52' miles N Long 24° 37' W

Saturday Aug 28th
 Fair, moderate wind from SE. steering SW by S
 This morning while the steward was taking down
 the port quarter light it exploded, singed his
 whiskers slightly, and spoiled the lantern. He was
 burning Petroleum oil in it. Crossed Equator last night
 Lat 1° 55' S Long 35° 55' W

Sunday Aug 29th
 Fair, with a strong wind from SE. steering SW by S
 Saw nothing worthy of note
 Lat 4° 25' S Long 28° 01' W

Monday Aug 30th
 Fair, with a strong wind from SE. steering SSW.
 Lat 6° 25' S Long 28° 43' W
