

Saturday September 21st

Fair this A.M. wind strong from NNE course SE by E. This afternoon foggy S.W. wind hauled from NW saw a large number of finbacks
Lat 38°10' S Long 18°06' E

Sunday Sept 22nd

Thick this morning and evening, moderate wind from NW. At 5 P.M. wind hauled from NW course SE by E and E. SE Took in studding sails at 5 P.M.
Lat 38°40' S Long 15°26' E

Monday Sept 23rd

Rainy this forenoon, also calm until 11 A.M. with S.W. steering full and by, on the starboard tack. Took out main hold to make better storage. Saw a sail on one weather beam, giving the same as us. This evening saw Blackfish but did not lose.
Lat 38°31' S Long 15°45' E

Tuesday Sept 24th

Fair moderate wind fair NW steering SE. Unbent the foretopmast staysail and stitched the seams and bent it again. Four sails in sight
Lat 38°55' S Long 17°44' E

Wednesday Sept 25th

Fair, blowing a gale from NW, course SE by E. Two men at the wheel, no one at the mast-heads have been carrying the main royal.
Lat 38°25' S Long 20°52' E

Thursday Sept 26th

Squally, and blowing strong gale from NW this forenoon course SE by E. Afternoon hauled from NW course SE. Set the studding sails at 7 A.M. and took them in at 7:30 A.M. Under double reefed topsails
Lat 38°25' S Long 24°11' E

Friday September 27th

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Fair, wind strong this forenoon from NW. Set the studding sails at 8 A.M. Took them in at 11 A.M. Afternoon set them again wind light from S. course SE. Saw finbacks and porpoises. Struck one of the latter, but lost him.
Lat 38°35' S Long 28°16' E

Saturday Sept 28th

Fair, wind variable from NW to NW course SE by E. This forenoon sent down the foretop sail, patched it and bent it again at 4 P.M. and set the studding sail. Calm all last night. Saw a sail
Lat 38°32' S Long 31°15' E

Sunday Sept 29th

Fair wind moderate from E, steering full and by, heading SE by S. Calm most of the night. Saw one sail, and a finback
Lat 39°10' S Long 31°52' E

Monday Sept 30th

Fair, wind strong from E steering full and by, heading SE by S. Took out water this morning. Saw a sail and finbacks. At 7 P.M. fuled the light sails
Lat 40°10' S Long 35°00' E

Tuesday Oct 1st

Fair, blowing a gale from E under close reefed topsails steering full and by, heading SE. At 7 P.M. shook out one reef in topsails. No one at masthead today
Lat 41°08' S Long 38°07' E

Wednesday October 2nd

Rainy and blowing a gale from NE. 11 A.M. fuled the mainsail and close reefed the topsails. 1 P.M. fuled the foresail and foretop sail, and hove her to
