

Thursday October 3rd

1867

Fair, blowing strong from W. At 8 o'clock last night wind hauled from W. made steering E. N. E. course today & let the studding sails but took them in again. Blowing to hulk. Have got royal set very cold and disagreeable weather

Lat 40° 25' S Long 48° 09' E

Friday Oct 4th

Fair, with a strong wind from W course. Obs. P. Saw a sail and large number of finbacks. Shifted the studding sails at 4 P.M. from starboard to the port side. Have got main royal set

Lat 41° 40' S Long 45° 41' E

Saturday October 5th

Fair, this forenoon but blowing a gale from N. E. course. E. P. E. The wind hauled at 2 A.M. At 11 A.M. double reefed the topsails. 1 P.M. closed reefed the an. topsails and furled the mainsail. 3 P.M. wind hauled from W with heavy squalls of wind and rain. Had to furl the topsail and clew up foresail. At 4 P.M. made all sail again. Steering E

Lat 39° 15' S Long 49° 17' E

Sunday October 6th

Fair, light wind from W course. Obs. P. Shifted the studding sails three times today. Let them at 9 last night. Saw four sails bound to the Eastward.

Lat 38° 13' S Long 53° 14' E

Monday October 7th

Fair, moderate wind from N. E. Steering full and by heading Obs. P. wind hauled last night. Broke out water this forenoon. Saw one sail. Chuck three porpoises but lost them

Lat 37° 39' S Long 56° 13' E

Tuesday October 8th

Fair, stiff breeze from N. W. course this forenoon. E. Let the studding sails at 7 A.M. At 1 P.M. shifted them from starboard to port side, course E. N. E. Saw one sail

Lat 37° 10' S Long 57° 41' E

Wednesday October 9th

Spally, wind strong from N. W. course N. E. by E. wind hauled last night from N. W. to N. E. Saw several finbacks. 6 P.M. set topgallant studding sails

Lat 35° 11' S Long 61° 07' E

Thursday October 10th

Fair, wind light from N. W. course N. E. This forenoon unhooked the mizen topmast stay sail and stowed it away. P.M. Broke out keel of butter. Saw finbacks

Lat 32° 45' S Long 63° 18' E

Friday October 11th

Fair, wind light from N. Steering full and by heading N. E. by E. This A.M. unhooked main, spencer and crepped up also the old flying jib. Koo painted all the boats on the crabs and on the house, color white. Saw a sail and a large number finbacks

Lat 30° 40' S Long 67° 18' E

Saturday October 12th

Fair, blowing strong from N. E. Steering full and by heading N. E. by E. Broke out this forenoon in after hold coal and filled a cask for blacksmithing, also pork and flour. At noon double reefed the topsails and furled the mainsail. 6 P.M. hove her to on port tack

Lat 29° 31' S Long 65° 52' E

Sunday Oct 13th

Fair, blowing strong from N. W. course N. at 8 o'clock last night squall struck us and split the foretop sail it was closed reefed

Lat 26° 40' S Long 65° 55' E
