

Saturday July 18th

Fair. wind light and baffling. This A.M. hove out mainhold and hauled back again. P.M. engaged at night ship, Comoro Island in sight bearing S by E. Killed two pigs this P.M.
Lat 11° 00' S Long 42° 43' E

Sunday July 19th

Fair. calm all night and today. Saw some gampass this afternoon. Comoro bore S by E 15 miles distant. Johanna all night. Had a sow that gave birth to 5 pigs this P.M. Lat 11° 08' S Long 42° 53' E

Monday July 20th

Fair. calm all night and this A.M. At 8 A.M. the starboard boat went ashore, which was 30 miles distant. Capt. Hicks and Mr. Reed went in her; armed with two revolvers apiece. They got ashore 1:30 P.M. but they did not leave boat. The natives looked to the crew and put down the foretopgallantail. This A.M. put some patches on it and side stitched it and bent it. Got a heep from Southard at 1 P.M. and lashed untill 4 P.M. the boat got back at 4 P.M. Comoro bore S by E 10 miles distant at 5:30 P.M.

Tuesday July 21st

Fair. wind strong from S.P.W. Got a heep from S at 7 P.M. last night and ran her off to Northard untill 8 A.M. when we hauled her on the wind: on the starboard tack. Engaged this A.M. in side stitching the jib; and bent it again. Comoro in sight evening S by E by compass.
Lat 10° 13' S Long 42° 41' E

Wednesday July 22nd

Fair. wind strong from S. Steering full and by on the starboard tack. Saw nothing worthy of note.
Lat 10° 20' S Long 44° 21' E

Thursday July 23rd

Fair wind strong from S. Steering full and by on the starboard tack. At noon furlled the topgallantails, but set them again at 4:30 P.M. Lashed ship at 6 P.M. but lashed back again at 7 P.M. Broke out flour this A.M.
Lat 11° 13' S Long 46° 13' E

Friday July 24th

Fair. wind moderate S.P.W. Steering full and by on the starboard tack. Hooked at 3:30 P.M.
Lat 11° 51' S Long 46° 12' E

Saturday July 25th

Fair. wind moderate S.P.W. Lashed ship at 8 A.M. and stood on the starboard tack untill noon. At 2 P.M. raised Korrilla and Koyotta bearing S steering W. At 5:30 P.M. raised Johanna ahead 20 miles distant. At 6 P.M. shortened sail, hauled aback mainyard at 7 P.M.

Sunday July 26th

Fair. wind strong from S. Braced forward at 3 A.M. and made sail at 4 A.M. Bent the cables at 5 A.M. Layed this afternoon the bark that Hindlow Capt. Buskel 14 men out with 80 Bbls. Speem.
