

Monday July 27th 1868
 Fair, wind from S. Came to anchor at 8 A.M. in Mahanah Harbour. but ran a line ashore and hove up again, so as to shift our anchorage. Elizabeth of Westport Capt Spaulding in here. S. Winslow arrived this morning. A large number of boats aboard.

Tuesday July 28th
 Fair, wind from S. Carried a raft of casks ashore this morning filled them with water and got another this afternoon.

Wednesday July 29th
 Fair, wind from S. Brought out main and after hold. Brought off a large raft of water and stowed it in fore and main hold.

Thursday July 30th
 Fine weather. carried a raft of casks ashore this morning filled them and hoisted them aboard. Starboard watch ashore on a run. Bark Pease arrived this forenoon.

Friday July 31st
 Fine weather. Starboard watch ashore on a run. Brought off a cask syrup this morning from the town.

Saturday Aug 1st
 Fine weather. Starboard watch ashore. also watch each from Elizabeth and S. Winslow.

Sunday Aug 2nd
 Fine weather. and very warm. Port watch ashore on a run.

Monday Aug 3rd
 Fair. Engaged at sending down fore and maintopgallant backstays, resewing and patching the eyes, and setting them up again. The natives have been bringing tara, sweet potatoes, beans, peanuts rice &c aboard. have got 80 lbs tara and 20 more coming.

Tuesday Aug 4th 1868
 Fair, wind from S. Got a small raft of water this morning. Capt. Hicks, Spaulding and Loois arrived this afternoon from Bombar. have been on a visit to King Abdalah, of Bohanna.

Wednesday Aug 5th
 Fine weather, wind light from N. Finished getting all our recruits aboard this afternoon, which consist of 100 Bbls of tara, 30 sweet potatoes, 5 yards of beans, 10 of peanuts, 600 lbs of sugar, 300 of rice, and some arrow root. 3 Bbls syrup, 200 coconuts and pumpkins and a live bullock. Were short at 5 P.M. Waited for the land heeps, which sprang up at 9 P.M. Got underweigh 9.30 P.M. All the ships gave three cheers and we returned them. Bark Elizabeth intends to sail tomorrow evening.

Thursday Aug 6th
 Fair, wind light from S. Have been steaming S. all this day. Saw the Beards bound into Bohanna. Stowed anchors and cables this morning. Spread out all the things that was in the potato pen to dry. Killed the bullock. Comore in sight on our port beam this afternoon.

Friday Aug 7th
 Fair, wind light from S. Course N.N.W. Spoke a brig this forenoon, she was about big, but under Portuguese colors, which were at half mast. she being short of provisions, and we supplied her. She was 40 days from Zanzibar, bound to Madagascar. We got a monkey and some chickens from her. Had all the tara on deck to dry. Stowing all the dry in main hold. Shortened sail this evening.
 Lat 10° 23' S Long 42° 32' E
