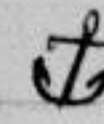



 Thursday January 7th 1869
 Equally with plenty of rain. wind E N E. Came to anchor at Dennis Id in 9 faths of water. Engaged at getting heads and hoops, also sails and cordage. Got some lettuce here.


 Friday Jan 8th
 Fine weather the latter part of day, wind E N E. Engaged at getting off the Shooks, and five cords of wood and stowed it.

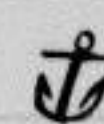
Saturday Jan 9th
 Fair, wind moderate from N E. Got underweigh this A.M. Engaged at diking our new Sills and setting up Shooks, scapins, iron work bent a new jib. Saw a French gunboat bound to Kake. Bird Id bore N E at 6 P.M.

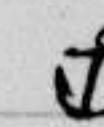
Sunday Jan 10th
 Rains most of the day, wind light and baffling this A.M. calm this P.M. Bird and Philout Ids in sight.

Monday Jan 11th
 Fair this A.M. wind light from N W. Engaged at setting up Shooks, painting the dead eyes and iron work. Sculling fore, main, and mizzen masts, and paint work on the quarter, deck. Raining this evening, and Bird Id bore E N E. Bound to Kake.

Tuesday Jan 12th
 Rains, wind light N N W. calm this evening. Philoutelle on our beam, and Kake ahead.


 Wednesday January 13th 1869
 Fair and very warm, wind very light from E. Came to anchor last night at 9 o'clock in 22 faths of water. Commenced to heave up at 4 A.M. and towed in with the boats about 8 miles, and came to anchor at the outer buoy, waiting for the doctor to board us he came aboard at 10:30 A.M. and got underweigh again, and came to anchor inside harbor in 9 faths of water. Peafix in here.


 Thursday Jan 14th
 Fair, calm most of the day. Engaged in painting ship, carried a raft of cases in to fill this P.M.


 Friday Jan 15th
 Fair, light breeze from E. Engaged at breaking out, in the main hatch and stopping water and filled the casks ashore. The bark John Windsor and Elizabeth quired this forenoon. The Elizabeth sold at Tranibar 12 lb of ambergris for \$600 in gold. she is going to send the rest of it to England. A boat from shore came this evening, with some wood, also last evening the crew ashore every evening. Raining this evening.


 Saturday Jan 16th
 Fair this A.M. but raining this P.M. wind N N W. Got off a raft of water this A.M. and stowed it.


 Sunday Jan 17th
 Fair, calm and very warm. Embarked watch ashore on liberty. Had a large dinner party aboard of the Peafix, a large number of ladies and gentlemen from Kake were there, and all the officers from the four ships. Our boats did the boating. All the wharves had their hunting hoisted.
