

Sunday February 27th

1869

Fair, wind moderate from N.W. Steering full
and by. Saw a Ship to the leeward this noon
Lat 10° 15' Long 59° 37' E

Monday Feb 28th

Fair, wind moderate from N.W. At 8 A.M.
Shaw Gifford raised a school of sperm whales.
on our weather bow going to the leeward
Lowered at 8:30 A.M. for them, but they got
galled and started to the windward
Came aboard at 10 A.M. and lowered again
at 1 P.M. larboard boat stuck and got one
The bark Elizabeth was whaling
to the leeward, but she did not
get any. Commenced cutting at
8 P.M. and finished at 9:30 P.M.



Lat 10° 29' Long 59° 38' E

Tuesday Feb 29th

Fair, wind N.W. but up all the flubber this
morning, and started the work at 6:30 A.M.
finishing the Elizabeth this evening

Lat 10° 30' Long 59° 40' E

Wednesday Feb 24th

Fair, wind moderate from N.W. Finished
boiling at 3 A.M. washed ship this morning
Engaged at breaking out, bread, sugar and syrup

Lat 10° 34' Long 59° 36' E

Thursday Feb 25th

Equally, wind from N.W. Engaged at breaking out
water casks and filling them with oil and
coopering it

Lat 10° 37' Long 59° 30' E

Friday February 26th

1869

Rainy, wind moderate from N.W. Engaged at
staving down oil in the main hold, on the
starboard side, following casks 377 + 288 + 150 + 155 = 912 galls
or 28 Bbls and 530 galls of sperm oil
Lat No Observations

Saturday Feb 27th

Rain all night and today, wind from N.W.
Have been running to the S.E. all day
Shifted the fore opposite back
No Observations

Sunday Feb 28th

Rainy, part of the day, wind N.W. saw nothing
worthy of note, except dolphins, caught one of them
Lat 10° 55' Long 60° 12' E

Monday March 1st

Fair, wind light from N.W. Engaged at breaking out
all the oil under the flubber room, coopered and
stowed it back again, about 5 Bbls leaked out.

Lat 10° 40' Long 59° 35' E

Tuesday Mar 2nd

Fair, wind light from N.W. Broke out all the bread
in main hatch and stowed it in the flubber room
Commenced to wet hold, this afternoon for the first
time I had the first time.

Lat 10° 40' Long 60° 00' E

Wednesday Mar 3rd

Fair, and very warm, calm all day, Engaged at
painting the ironwork, had light squalls of rain

Lat 10° 50' Long 59° 45' E
