

Sunday March 28th

1869

Fair wind light from N. Steering full and by.
Have been on the banks all day. A sail in sight
Lat 9°55' S Long 60°14' E.

Monday Mar 29th

Fair wind light and baffling. Steering full and by.
Engaged at breaking out all the oil in the fore and
main hold on the port side, cooped and stowed
bagge all the ground tier on port side.
Found several casks that have been leaking. Tamed
the Elizabeth this evening. Have been standing by the
new watches since last night and all hands on
deck daytime Lat 10°13' S Long 59°58' E.

Tuesday Mar 30th

Fair wind light from N. Engaged at breaking out
all the oil in fore and main hold on the
starboard side, cooped the ground tier, and stowed
it back again. Have a 10 Bbl cask of sperm oil
and it all leaked out in the hold.
Lat 9°54' S Long 59°50' E.

Wednesday Mar 31st

Fair wind strong from N. N. W. under double reef topsails
very muggy. Hove off the riding tie on the port side
and some on the starboard side. Waiting for casks to
put oil in. Lat 10°00' S Long 59°46' E.

Thursday April 1st

Fair wind strong from N. Finished stowing down all
all the oil. Had to condemn four casks. the staves
and heads were rotten, and repaired six more.
Under double reefed topsails all day.

Friday April 2nd

Fair wind moderate from N. N. W. Steering full
and by. Engaged at reppining casks.
Lat 9°50' S Long 59°58' E

Saturday April 3rd

Fair wind light from N. Steering full and by.
Engaged at scraping and scrubbing the bulwarks.
with lye. Tamed the Elizabeth Capt. Spaulding
this evening.
Lat 10°12' S Long 59°58' E

Sunday April 4th

Fair wind light from N. N. W. Steering full and by.
Thuck two bulheads and spert them
Lat 11°00' S Long 59°42' E

Monday April 5th

Fair wind light from N. Steering N. N. W. Bound
to Sandy Island Engaged at fixing the cable to
the main rigging. Tamed the Elizabeth
Lat 11°30' S Long 59°00' E

Tuesday April 6th

Cloudy wind variable. Steering N. N. W. Engaged at breaking
out Shooks in after hold and water in main
hold, and stowing empty water casks. Saw a fishback
Lat 12°00' S Long 58°00' E

Wednesday April 7th

Fair wind light and baffling. Steering full and by.
The wind hauled at 4 P. M. from E. S. E. course
N. N. W. had a light squall of rain this afternoon.
Engaged at making penants to the foretopmast.
tagged sheets. Ref. hold this afternoon
Lat 12°15' S Long 58°10' E
